THE YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST AND PARISH

The new liturgical year starts next weekend with the ***First Sunday of Advent*** and begins the **Year of the Eucharist and the Parish** in our diocese. At the Last Supper, Jesus taught us how he wanted to be worshipped – at a meal. The Eucharist is meant to be shared and lived in community. Food by its very nature brings us together. It is clear that Jesus wants us to come together for the Eucharist in living the Faith with one another. The parish family is where believers are united as community. It is where God gathers his people, and where God calls us to the banquet he has prepared.

CHRIST, KING OF ALL

On this, the final Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King. By concluding the year with this feast, we are proclaiming our faith that Jesus Christ is the one and only king over all seasons, all peoples, and all of creation.

At the end of time as we know it, Christ's work of restoring all things to unity and harmony with their Creator God will be completed. This Sunday, when we claim Christ as both our Shepherd and our King, we recognize our own calling to participate in Christ's saving work by caring for those whom Jesus calls "the least ones" (Matthew 25:45).

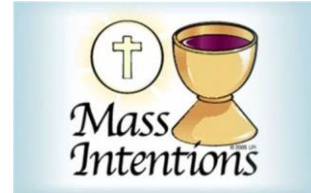
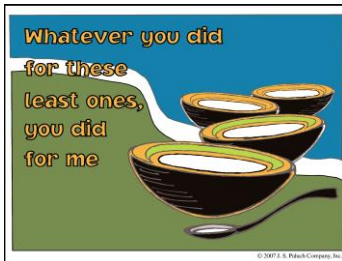
TODAY'S READINGS
