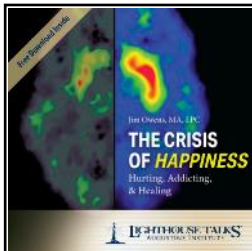

Early in the Gospel of John, we have this remarkable encounter between Jesus and the Woman at the Well. This conversation shouldn't have happened... Jesus shouldn't have engaged an unaccompanied woman in conversation, let alone a Samaritan, let alone a public sinner. But He did!!! Here is the final exchange:

The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything."

Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one speaking with you."

Jesus acknowledges clearly and directly that He is the Messiah, the Christ. In many other places and situations, He does this indirectly, but with this woman who has had such a difficult journey, He affirms His identity boldly. She responds with conviction and sincerity by sharing the truth of who Jesus is with the other people in her life.

As we have our own history and journey, our own failures and sins, and even unresolved struggles in the present, **there is so much hope here for us!** Let Jesus speak to your heart, respond to Him in honesty and openness... there's no limit to what He can do in us and through us.

Much has been cancelled in the last few days: in-person classes at the universities, K-12 school, faith formation, and some upcoming events, including Sr. Renee's talks and the upcoming NET retreat.
