

“Thus says the LORD: ‘You, son of man, I have appointed watchman for the house of Israel; when you hear me say anything, you shall warn them for me.’” This from the prophet Ezekiel in our first reading this Sunday.

Jesus echoes this command in the Gospel, speaking to His disciples, “If your

brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother.”


That sure doesn’t sound like “I’ll do me, you do you!” Far from encouraging us to pretend we don’t know what good and bad behavior looks like, **Jesus specifically instructs us to address sinful behavior by approaching the person who has sinned against us directly.** Certainly we could do this poorly, unfairly, aggressively, etc... but the fact that it could be done poorly doesn’t mean we shouldn’t try to do it well. On some level, to try would be simple obedience to our Lord Jesus!

Let’s put the shoe on the other foot... how do we respond when someone approaches us to address a mistake we’ve made! Oof... that’s a different matter! **But if Jesus commands us to be willing to correct another, I think He’s also calling us to be willing to receive correction.** I know... I don’t like it either!!! Come Holy Spirit!

Let’s all pray for all our school administrators, teacher, professors, students and parents as this school year begins. We’re off to a good start at St. Al’s, and so far it doesn’t look like Michigan Tech is reporting significant positive tests so far... **God guide us in every complexity and struggle!**

We’ve got a different schedule to kick off the Faith Formation year... some outdoor events in September and classes starting on Sunday, Oct. 4th, God-willing. We’re also going to try some Saturday morning Masses JUST for families with little kids: 9 am on Aug. 29 and Sept. 5, 12, & 19.


