Increasing Church Seating Capacity

Bishop John recently issued a letter regarding church capacity. "[E]ffective on Easter, pastors are given the discretion to increase the capacity of their churches, while maintaining all of the rest of the COVID-19 safety protocol." As per my recent letter to parishioners, at St. Al's and St. Anne's, we seem to be doing fairly well with having adequate seating, so we will be leaving the blocked off pews in place for now.

Basic Pandemic Safety Reminders

- If you have a **positive COVID test or COVID symptoms**, please do not come to Mass.
- Please wear a **mask** in church.
- Please **sanitize** your hands when you arrive, and before communion in the pew, if you can.
- Please observe **social distance spacing**: every other pew is blocked, a spot for one or two people at each end. If you're a family of three or more, please take a whole pew.
- Bishop John encourages everyone to receive **communion in the hand**, and please **stay spaced** out in the line.
- No collection: but please put something in the basket up front if you can! We are grateful for your support!

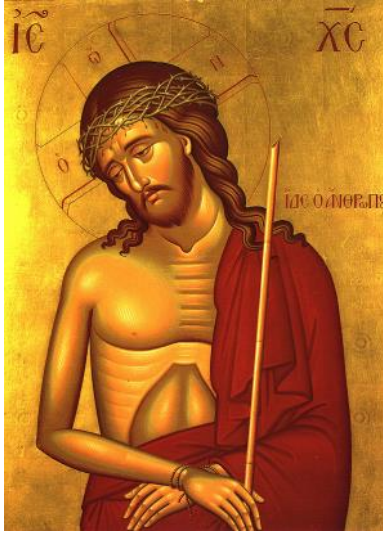

Dating and Courtship What elements are essential during dating and courtship to discern whether you are following God's will?

Kimberly Hahn, wife of Dr. Scott Hahn, shares rich her personal experiences as a Christian woman, wife, and mother. She provides practical advice and encourages setting high standards according to God's ways.

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.”



This passage from the Second Reading from Palm Sunday captures the lengths to which Jesus was willing to go to save us! **To what lengths should we be willing to go to follow Him?**

Palm Sunday begins Holy Week. **I hope we are all keenly aware of the blessing of being able to practice our faith publicly**, especially after begin without public liturgies at this time last year. Please make every effort to participate fully this week, both by coming to the liturgies, but also by living a daily life of recollection and prayer!

One aspect of our Lenten discipline that bears discussion is the Paschal, or Easter, Fast. The Church requires that we fast and abstain on Good Friday (April 2, this year), but the ancient tradition encourages us to sustain that fast through Holy Saturday. Holy Saturday is a somber and solemn day as we remember Christ laying in the tomb, descending to the netherworld (Hades or Sheol), that place where those who died before Christ waited.

I wasn't really aware of any of this growing up, or I didn't tune in. **I think there's great spiritual fruit that comes from really entering into the fullness of the Triduum...** the three main liturgies (Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Celebration of the Passion, and the Easter Vigil). That "entering in" goes beyond the liturgies themselves, including taking part in Adoration on Holy Thursday evening, observing Good Friday as a day of sober recollection, and also participating as fully as possible in the fast that leads up to the Easter Vigil.

There are regularly-scheduled confessions this week at St. Al's on Tuesday (7:30 pm) and Wednesday (7:30 pm). There will also be "Last Chance" confessions at St. Al's on Holy Saturday from 11 am to 1 pm. **There is no better preparation for Easter than to make a good confession!**

Thank you to everyone who helped organize and who participated in the Living Stations last Sunday. They were beautiful. One little guy said to his dad afterwards, "Why was I the only one crying?" He wasn't! *God Bless, Fr. Ben*

Return your Rice Bowl on Holy Thursday! For Holy Thursday, the Roman Missal states, "there may be a procession of the faithful in which gifts for the poor may be presented with the bread and wine." This is a great last chance for Lenten almsgiving. **Please bring your Rice Bowl and/or nonperishable food items to donate on Holy Thursday, April 1.**

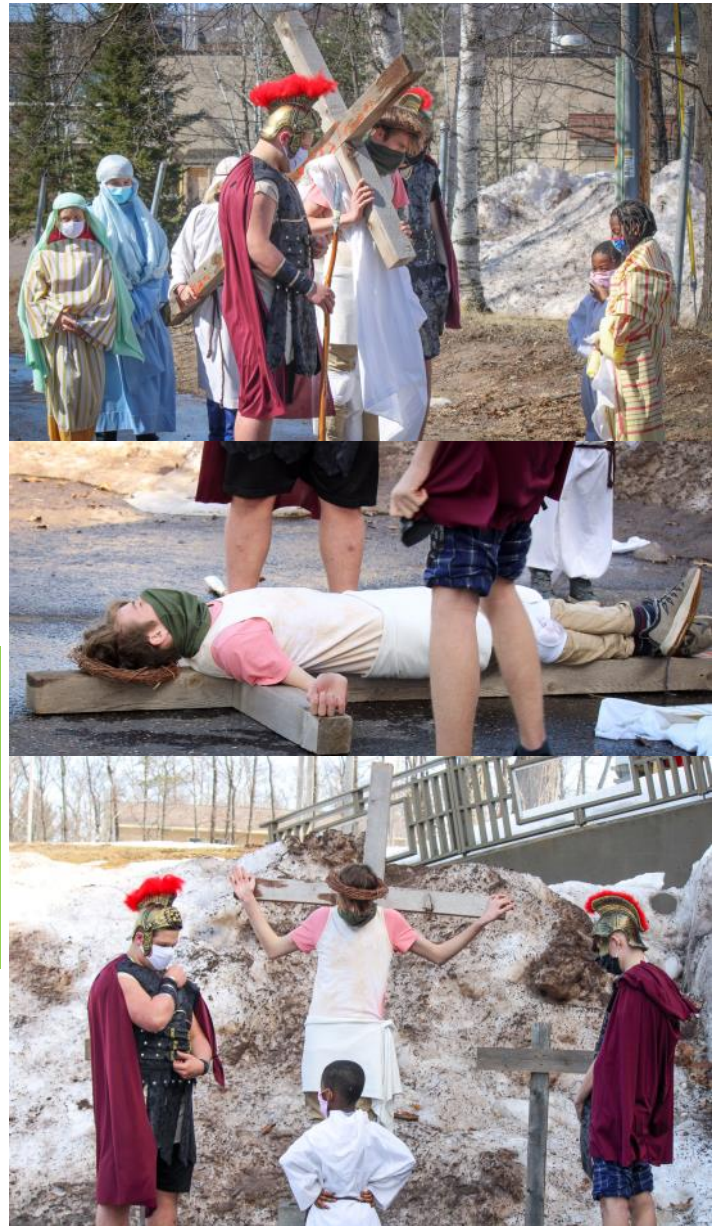
