BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the first Sunday of the month at 12 Noon (except during Lent). Parents must contact the parish office in advance; first-time parents are required to attend a baptism formation session.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholics who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish office.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the parish office for more information about the RCIA.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Please call the parish office to arrange for a pastoral visit, Anointing of the Sick, and/or Holy Communion for those who are ill or elderly and unable to come to church.

Arrangements should be made one year in advance of the wedding. Please contact the parish office before booking a reception venue. Once a wedding date is confirmed, a priest or deacon will assist with the required marriage preparation process.

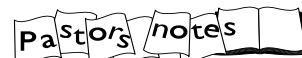

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21

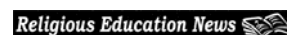

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

One man wanted to follow Jesus when he had finished his duties at home. Jesus expressed that a man who begins a task, but constantly looks back is unfit for the reign of God.

My Dear sisters & brothers,
 Prayerful greetings to you. I am Fr. A. Vincent, coming to your parish for the MCP. Be generous towards our poor diocese. Our Diocese is situated in the reserved forest area. Majority of the people are illiterate and do not know

about the family planning; each family has not less than 7-8 children. As they are landless, daily wage laborers are unable to send the children to the available schools. Due to the poverty, once the children are about 10-12 years old they send the children to graze cows, buffaloes, goats and sheep and pigs of the landlords to get some income in order to support the family. The other problem in India is, as there is no custom of remarriage if one of the parents die, the single parent having 6-7 children unable to provide food and clothing they come to the priest to request them to take care of these orphan and semi-orphan children in the orphanages and boarding homes. Your generous donation will go a long way to helping these children to have a little nutritious food, books, stationery and other basic needs. **Thank you very much!** Your donation will make a real difference in the lives of these underprivileged and orphan children. Thank you once again for your donation. It means the world to us!
