Dear Brothers & Sisters,

If you've been down to the church basement lately, you've probably noticed that the bulletin boards and chalk boards are down, and the furniture has been moved away from the walls. We had this preparation done early, to make things easier for the painters when they come in. The work of preparing and then painting the walls is scheduled to begin this week, and should hopefully be completed by the end of the month.

After the areas that have deteriorated are repaired, the entire basement will be repainted. Other limited repairs (replacement of some failing ceiling tiles, for example) are anticipated. We also plan to put the exhaust fans on a timer, so that they will run for a period of time every day. This should prevent the musty smell and also help to keep things dry.

I'm grateful for those who are working on this project: Lou Garlatti and his assistant, Ramon, from Albert Garlatti Construction in Highland Park, and Randy Rega and his crew from Bernardsville Painting and Contracting. The total cost of this work in the church basement will be in the range of \$15,000. While we are currently able to meet the expense, we have already been operating at a deficit, so any contributions to help offset this cost will be greatly appreciated.

It's important to me that, in the midst of talking about contractors, logistics, and finances, we remember the reason for doing this work. This is an investment for our children, to ensure a safe and attractive space for them to learn about their faith, and for our parents' peace of mind in bringing their children to religious education. It also sends a message to families who may be searching for a spiritual home, that we are serious about providing the best we have to offer for the next generation of disciples.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c

Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18

Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to his ideals is what matters most.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.
