Are you not entertained!? This is a famous question from Maximus in "Gladiator," a movie from 2000 that netted over \$350 million. According to *statista.com*, in 2020 the entertainment and media market in the United States is expected to be worth over 720.38 billion U.S. dollars. On a global scale, the entertainment and media market was worth 1.72 trillion U.S. dollars in 2015 and is set to rise to 2.14 trillion by 2020. In 2016, the industry sold over 24.5 billion games and generated more than \$30.4 billion in revenue. Finally there were 495 scripted TV shows running at once in 2018, and that number has been higher each year since 2008/2009 when it was around 200. I enjoy an hour or two of TV sometimes, but why so much entertainment? Where does the supply and demand come from? There are many reasons I can think of: escape; living in a fantasy; fun; relief; seeking goodness, truth and beauty; learning lessons about life and investigating something we previously never new about. Maybe we are looking for God? Whatever we are ultimately looking for, it is available for us in Holy Week's masses and liturgies. But not only do we watch them, we do them.
