Since April of 2002 the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland has published on its website the names of those clerics who were removed from ministry from 2002 through the present as a result of the sexual abuse of a child. At Bishop Perez's direction, this information has now been compiled in a list format and updated to include the names of additional diocesan clerics who were removed from ministry as a result of sexual abuse of a child or who is already deceased or no longer in ministry for any reason and against whom have been made substantiated allegations of child sexual abuse. The new names of diocesan clerics were added after the diocese concluded, based on the evidence available to it, that the allegations were more likely than not to be true. In compiling this updated information, the diocese reviewed all known allegations regardless of how long ago the alleged abuse occurred or whether the cleric was alive or deceased.

While the updating of this information is certainly an occasion of profound sadness, inasmuch as it reminds us of the great harm experienced as a result of sexual abuse, may it also be an occasion for healing and a step towards restoring trust in the Church.

PASTOR'S NOTE

Summer is a great time to ask new questions and/or finally find answers to some old ones. Let's practice! **What is this Town Hall Forum going to be like on July 16th at St. Bernard?** We now have some preliminary scope and results of every need our building has through a completed engineering study. The intention of the meeting is to present those results and surface ideas for the projects most worthy of our pursuit, as well as to surface ideas for people and strategies that might help us to accomplish these priorities. **What is this "Urban Renaissance Festival" at St. Mary all about?** One of the goals of both St. Mary Parish and St. Mary School is to have interaction and involvement with each other. Therefore, the idea of a Festival surfaced as something that we could do together. The mission of St. Mary remains, in part, to share the good news of the Gospel with the greater community, and so opening this up to the larger community became an idea. Also, Akron seems to be going through a Renaissance right now and Fr. Abuse Scandal? In our own diocese, there is not much more to be done. The rules, regulations and reporting hotlines have created a culture that expects transparency and will not accept abuse in any form by any one. All church employees must re-submit federal background checks every 5 years, read the diocesan policies on child safety and get personally audited by diocesan administration staff for compliance. There are also mandatory classes taught to students in all religion classes on recognizing and reporting abuse. We will have books available from Bishop Barron about what to do next by the doors of the church. We will pray for and assist victims. We will all be more vigilant.
