PASTOR'S NOTE

Friends,

As you probably heard, we came together as a diocesan community this past Tuesday at the cathedral to mourn the loss and pray for the repose of the soul of Bishop Richard G. Lennon. I'd like to share some things about him in honor and memory of him this week, most of which I found on dioceseofcleveland.org/news. Even the whole Funeral Mass is archived there if you would like to watch it.

A native of the Boston, Massachusetts area, Bishop Lennon was named by Pope Benedict XVI as the 10th bishop of Cleveland on April 4, 2006. He was installed on May 15, 2006 in the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist to lead the country's 23rd largest diocese with nearly 800,000 Catholics. Pope Francis accepted Bishop Lennon's resignation from pastoral governance of the Diocese of Cleveland on December 28, 2016 and granted him early retirement. Bishop Lennon made the request in a letter to the pope in late November 2016, citing his ongoing health challenges as the reason for his decision to retire. He was notable for his sense of humor, his strong organizational skills, initiating and leading a major campaign for the future of the diocese called Rooted In Faith, Forward In Hope, being a stickler at times, concluding the vibrant parish life process that began before he got here that resulted in the merger and then de-merger of our two parishes and many others and doing things that standardized us and moved us forward as a diocesan community like relocating all the diocese offices under one roof, reviewing and revising the priest, deacon and lay ministry programs and many diocesan documents, and keeping strong our Catholic Charities programs and services.

Even though, at times, people remember him for being too tough, he really did have a great sense of humor! When it was my turn to be interviewed by him prior to ordination, he asked me to name all 12 minor prophets in the Bible. I freaked out for a second and then he said, "Relax! I'm not going to make you do that. It was a joke." Also, when he called his good friend to tell him of his resignation, he also asked his friend to preach his funeral, but "not to eulogize him because he was not a saint." He was the first to admit he had need of greater conversion in his own life. Lastly, I will always remember him saying to us seminarians, "Not all decisions are politically motivated, but all decisions do have political (/social/public) consequences." In such ways as these and when at his best, Bishop Lennon was a realist.

Certainly, none of us is perfect! Therefore, during this month of November we pray for all those who have died and their loved ones. When you do so, please include a prayer for Bishop Lennon and his family and friends mourning his death. May his soul and all of the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace!
