Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Since St. John Paul II's 1992 Apostolic Exhortation "Pastores Dabo Vobis," all seminaries throughout the world have been responsible for forming and evaluating seminarians upon "the four pillars." The pillars mean the aspects of the person. The pillars are: 1) *Intellectual* – The content of the faith and of multiple areas of study necessary to minister well and the capacity to reason and be logical; 2) *Spiritual* – Time spent in prayer, knowing well the praxis of liturgy and actually praying it frequently throughout the day as the source and returning place of your life, discerning God's presence in your life and you in God's life and relating to others and to the things of the earth from a perspective of Spirituality, ultimately leading to confidence in your vocational call and decision; 3) *Pastoral* – Being capable and effective at pastoral service, especially in proclaiming the Word, teaching, celebrating the sacraments and offering counsel and leadership; and 4) – *Human Being* a person capable of forming and nurturing relationships with others and with God so that the other three areas can occur well and effectively, also having adequate self-control, self-understanding, self-appreciation and an ever-evolving plan for living in balance and being a person of communion. This includes psychological evaluation. All four areas involve two monthly meetings with advisors; one to work personally and confidentially on all four areas, especially Spirituality, and one to work on how the development is going, objectively speaking, based on the observations of all involved. St. John Paul II implemented the fourth area and each conference of bishops in the world has to submit and have approved a way that the seminaries in their territories will implement the four pillars. Each of the four need each other to go well and should be developed more or less on par with each other. At the national bishops' meeting last week, approved was a sixth edition that all USA seminaries will operate by. I am not sure what this edition contains exactly, but each subsequent edition has been an improvement based on experience of how to continue to better prepare a seminarian to be a priest. I mention this not just to give the news and some intellectual and pastoral formation, I mention this to point out that the four-pillar model is really a good tool for evaluating ourselves individually, as communities and especially as the community that is the Church. This weekend we celebrate Christ the King! Advent begins next week. Four Pillars... Christ the King... check! Is Christ the King of what you learn and study in your spare time? Do you want to know more about Him and know Him more Himself? Can you locate where He is calling you at this point in life? Are you at His service? Are you living for Him and to share His goodness with all? Is your service led by the Holy Spirit? Are you having difficult blocks in your relationships that His ways and teaching might speak help and healing to? Do you welcome and try for a relationship with the Father, The Son, the Holy Spirit, The Blessed Mother and the Communion of Angels and Saints? Christ would like to be the kingly authority over all our things and all our relationships too. How nice the world would be if that would happen! May we welcome and follow His leadership and Kingship in all we do. If Kanye West can say and live "Jesus Is King," (the title of his latest album) maybe we can too!!! May Christ Be King of Everything You Do This Week!!!
