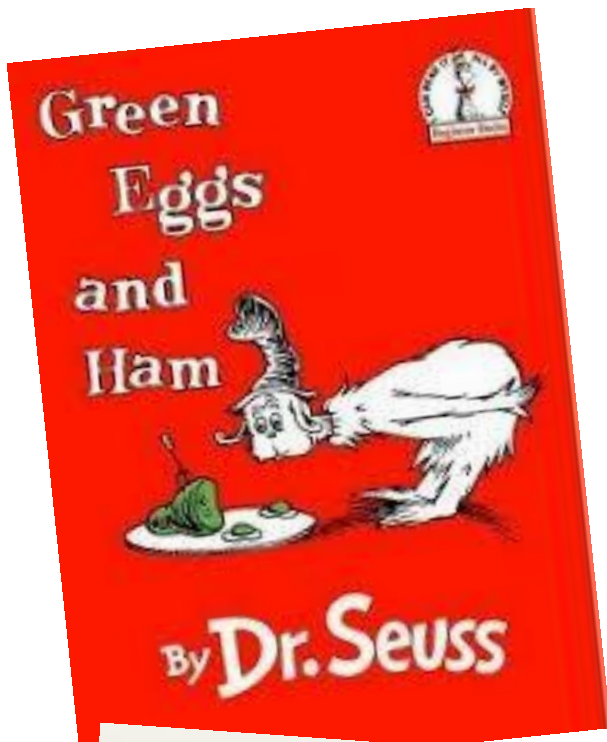


Read a Create

Make a bird feeder.

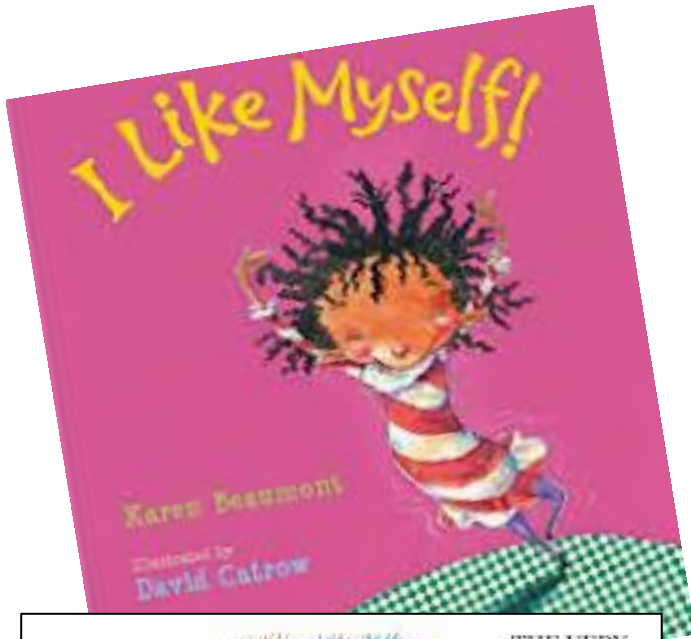
Paint a bird house.

Let the book inspire your creativity.

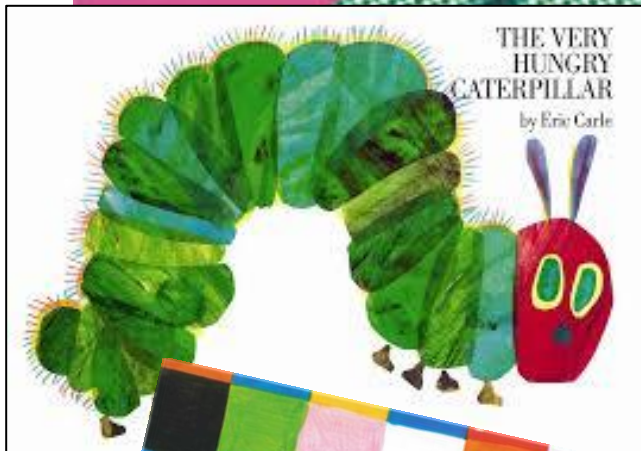
Be an author and/or the illustrator of your own book.

Write what you like about yourself.

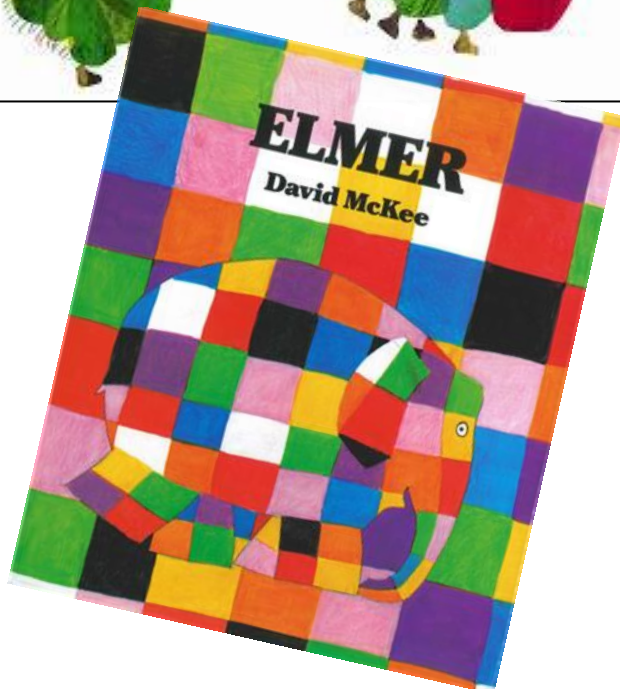
Write an original story about you, something you enjoy, places you like to visit...
