CELEBRATING THE LITURGY WORTHILY AND WELL

“ALL SOULS NOVENA”

If he were not expecting that those who had fallen would rise again, it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead. But if he was looking to the splendid reward that is laid up for those who fall asleep in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Therefore he made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:44-45)

Why pray for the dead?

Since the Old Testament (2 Macc 12:44-45) people have prayed and offered sacrifices for the dead so that their sins might be forgiven and they might be purified. We are part of a great family, the Church, and we benefit from the prayers of all the Church. This is true while we are still in this life, but it is also true when we die and go before God for judgment. We know we are not perfect, and when we die there are still debts left unpaid, before we are completely holy in God’s sight. God is a “Consuming Fire” and on that day we will suffer great pain and loss as all the imperfection is burned away (1 Cor 3:15). Jesus says if we have not settled our accounts before judgment, we will be in “prison” until we have paid the last penny (Mt 5:25-26). This final purification takes place after death in Purgatory, and souls in Purgatory receive great consolation from the love, support, and prayers of their brothers and sisters in Christ. Let us pray for the dead, as one day we hope others will remember to pray for us when we come to that moment.

Visits to the Cemetery

In addition to the All Souls Novena, we should also try visit the graves of our departed on All Souls Day, or during the month of November. Bring flowers or candle, Holy Water, and offer prayers at the gravesite.

Mass Intention Book

We encourage parishioners to schedule Masses for loved ones on the anniversary of their death or close to their anniversary. If you would like to offer a Mass, please come to the office during regular office hours: Monday thru Thursday ~ 9am - 2pm. The offering for a Mass intention is \$5, however an offering of \$10 is requested for the Vigil Mass and the Sunday evening Mass. The **2020 Mass Intention Book is now open.** Intentions will be entered on a first come, first serve basis.

Choir Ministry

Adults, youth, and children are needed. Help lead the congregation in the worship of God through singing. Grow in your knowledge and love of the liturgy. In the upcoming weeks we are preparing for Advent, and the Solemnity of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Rehearsals are on Wednesday evenings from 6:00pm – 7:30pm.

Thank you to the youth who are doing a great job with liturgical music at the Sunday 10am and 5pm Masses. Reminder that all in the congregation should sing the hymns, Responsorial Psalm, and Mass prayers. Hymn selections are listed on hymnboards: E = entrance, O = offertory, C = communion, R = recessional.

Sunday 5pm Mass

We need parishioners from the Sunday evening Mass to volunteer for the following ministries. At least two per ministry, to alternate their schedules. All must attend diocesan CMSE class.

Sacristan – open and close church, set up for the Mass. Arrive 45 minutes before, leave 30 minutes after Mass. Period of training required. Must be active Catholic in good standing.

Reader – prepare and proclaim the Scripture readings. Must be active Catholic in good standing

Choir – assist with supervision of choir loft during the Mass. Arrive 30 minutes early. Must attend Wednesday evening choir rehearsals.

Usher – assist with collection, Mass count, hospitality. Arrive 15 minutes before, leave 15 minutes after Mass.

ADULT FORMATION CLASSES

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents whose children need Baptism must attend the monthly Baptism Preparation Meeting with Fr. Mullan at least 2 months in advance (first Sundays at 2pm). The actual Baptism date, normally on a Sunday after 8:00am Mass, will be confirmed once all paperwork, fees, and requirements have been completed. Parents need to be registered parishioners and active in their Catholic faith. *Please contact the office to update your parish registration and confirm the date you will attend the next Baptism meeting.* Additional requirements (godparents, birth certificates, bible classes) will be explained at the meeting. Parents and Godparents can start attending the required adult Bible classes on Wednesdays at any time (please check the column marked "Baptism" when you sign in).

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples wishing to marry must attend the monthly Marriage Preparation meeting with Fr Mullan at least 6 months in advance (usually fourth Sundays at 2pm), to begin preparations for the Sacrament of Marriage. *Please contact the office to update your parish registration and confirm the date for the class you plan to attend.* Wedding date can be scheduled only after this meeting has taken place, and after it has been determined that no *prior marriage bond* exists. Additional requirements (sacramental certificates, retreats, Natural Family Planning, Affidavits of Free Status, bible classes) will be explained at the meeting. Couples can start attending the required adult Bible classes on Wednesdays at any time (please check the column marked "Marriage" when you sign in).
