A LETTER FROM FATHER ED:

Dear parishioners of St. Mary of the Visitation, Most years the clergy moves for the Diocese of Hamilton take place on the last Wednesday of June and so on June 30th at high noon I will become the pastor of your parish.

So let me introduce myself. I am 54 years old and was born and raised in Kitchener. I grew up on the family farm which was situated on the south end of Kitchener. Our farm was located directly behind what is now the Williamsburg cemetery. My parents now live in town, but my brother is continuing to farm on the Roseville Road. He has a lovely herd of Brown Swiss cows for anyone who drives out that way.

After graduating from Cameron Heights High School, I studied science at the University of Waterloo but changed gears and entered the seminary. For the first two years I lived at Resurrection College in Waterloo while I completed my degree and then studied theology at St. Peter's Seminary in London. I was ordained a priest by Bishop Tonnos on May 6, 1995. (I had a very quiet Covid lockdown celebration for my silver jubilee). My first assignment was with Father Sherlock at St. Clement's parish in Preston. So after almost 25 years I am returning to Cambridge. (Although being from Waterloo Region I do know the difference between Hespeler, Preston and Galt). As a priest I have served in all the deaneries of the Diocese with the exception of the northern Bruce/Grey deanery. St. Mary's will be my third parish to serve as pastor. I was pastor at St. John's in Guelph from 2004-2012 and St. Paul's Burlington from 2012-present. I am certain that I will see some familiar faces in Hespeler, including the odd relative or two who are members of the parish. The Mass for Canada Day will be my first official duty at your parish. Hope to see you then.
