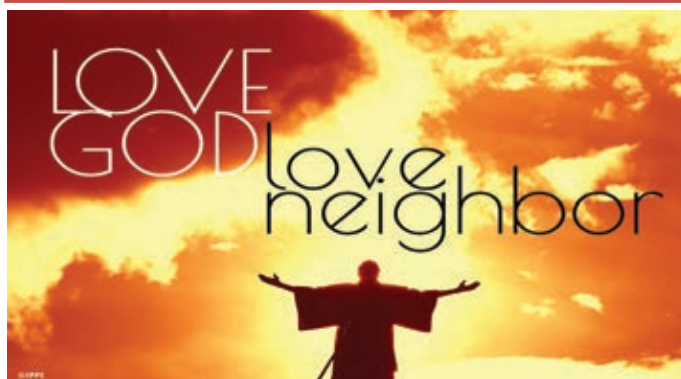

Weekly Reflection

October 25, 2020

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Voted among the “Ten worst songs of the 70’s” by readers of “Rolling Stone” magazine was an item sung by Brazilian singer Morris Albert simply called Feelings.” But in 1975, the year of its release, it was named by the “People’s Choice” as “the favorite new song.” Interesting how times change. I realize that many of you hearing me or reading this have no idea of what I am talking about, so please Google the song to find out.

For my purpose here, I’d like to quote the Rolling Stone reviewer Andy Greene. The song has been mocked for a good 40 years as one of the ten worst largely for its lack of specificity. What kind of feelings is Morris singing about? It’s clearly a love song, but it’s hard to think of a vaguer term than “feelings” to describe, um, “feelings.” Many good Christians reading or hearing today’s Gospel section from Matthew are frustrated in their pursuit of perfection when they learn that they must love not only God, but also their neighbor. “Must” is the operative word. “How,” they ask, “am I supposed to love the difficult person who is my residential neighbor?” (You can supply different adjectives to describe that neighbor.) The problem intensifies for good faithful people, a lot like you, when they learn that “neighbor” is a worldwide description of people, most of whom they don’t even know. The root of the difficulty is that word “feelings.” Feelings are morally neutral. They are fleeting sometimes, but always involve an affection for someone we deem as “special” and worthy of our attention. They are the stuff of Valentine’s Day, wrapped in roses and chocolate for one of the opposite sex. And of deep perennial affection for a chosen friend of the same or opposite sex alike. They are, so to speak, “warm and fuzzy.”

The love Our Lord Jesus mandates has nothing at all to do with feelings. It is, in the instance cited here, a willed fidelity to the Covenant between Yahweh and Israel. In a more general application, this love is a matter of willing and doing. We freely choose to love God. That, in turn, is described by Jesus in another place as ‘keeping His commandments.’ Regarding our neighbor, it means we wish all the best for them. Even if they repulse us at times. Even if we wished they lived a thousand miles away. Even if they have betrayed us. For that last, consult Jesus’ reaction to Judas’ kiss.

Once on a railroad train an elderly man accidentally broke a minor regulation and was unmercifully bawled out by a young train employee. Later a fellow passenger nudged the old gentleman and suggested he give the employee a piece of his mind. But the old man just smiled. “Oh,” he said, “if a man like that can stand himself for all of his life, I surely can stand him for five minutes.”

Saint of the Week

Jude, Apostle

Judas Thaddeus, called Jude to distinguish him from Judas Iscariot, is often regarded as the brother of the Apostle, Saint James the Less. Other than a mention in the listing of the Apostles in the Gospels, there is only one reference to Jude anywhere in the New Testament. At the Last Supper, Jesus tells the Apostles that he will reveal himself to them. Jude then asked him, “Master, what happened that you will reveal yourself to us and not to the world?” Jesus answered and said to him, “Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.” (Jn 15:23).

Jude’s message today: In a vision to Saint Bridget of Sweden, Jesus noted that Jude would “show himself most willing to help.” Many people who have called on Saint Jude, like Danny Thomas, have found work after extended unemployment. Others with terminal illnesses have recovered after turning to Saint Jude.

When you have reached the end of your rope and all seems lost, say a prayer to Saint Jude. He will help you too.

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Background: For one last time Jesus reminds the devout religious people of his day that life as a Christian is not built on keeping rules and regulations but on a love of God so all-embracing that it includes all human beings made in the divine image and even, as Pope Francis has stated, all of God’s creation.

Discussion Questions:

- ◆ Whom do you not want to be your neighbor? Are you disturbed when interacting with a person of a different color, class, creed, sexual orientation, political party, educational background, nationality, age, and so on?
- ◆ An easy trap to fall into is thinking that we should help only those who are “deserving.” What limits have you set for those who deserve the support of your time, talent, or treasure?
- ◆ How have you helped someone to feel included at work, in your family, or in your neighborhood?
- ◆ How do you think that Jesus is calling the devout religious people of our day to be more inclusive?

Practice: Big picture activism has its place, but so does grass roots involvement. Where might you make a difference by your involvement in a community council or recycling effort or Girl or Boy Scout troop?

THE CHALLENGE OF LOVE

Today's readings challenge us to love – love God and love our neighbor as ourselves. Do you know someone who would like to know more about our God who showers us love, Jesus, or the Catholic faith? Invite that person to call about an RCIA Inquiry Session. Participation in a session does not require a commitment to belong to the Catholic Faith Family. Anyone who is unbaptized, baptized into a non-catholic Christian denomination, or baptized Catholic but never received First Eucharist and Confirmation, is invited to come and inquire about Jesus who tells us that a person's basic worth is not derived from anything less than God's unconditional love for all of his children and the Community of faith that can help us to understand the dignity inherent to that status. During the Pandemic the RCIA Inquiry sessions might be virtual.



MERCY CORNER

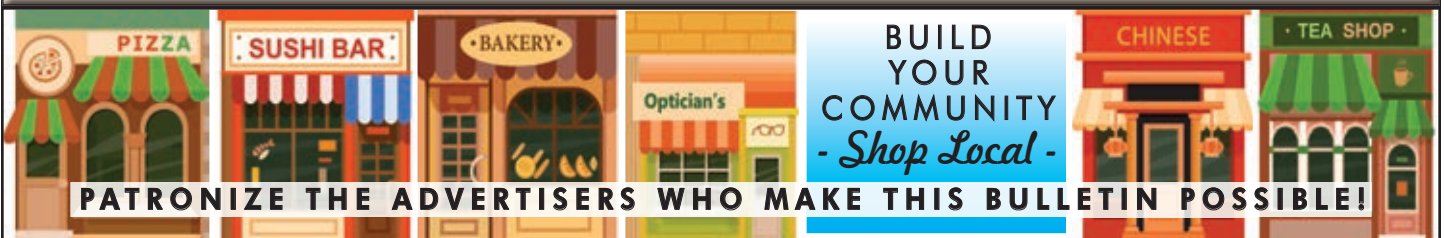
