Weekly Reflection

January 31, 2021

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Live a while in our very human world and you soon learn that many a promise is broken. So much so that we are amazed when they are kept, especially over a long time. How many hearts have been broken by this very human failure we can only guess. So it is very reassuring and definitely cause for rejoicing to learn from the Bible that God is the exception. He keeps every promise He makes. Admittedly there may be extensive time gaps between promise made and promise kept. But then we also know that God's ways are not ours. The times described in Deuteronomy, our First Reading today, were long gone when events like those recounted in the Gospels took place. Deuteronomy captures the day when, speaking through Moses, God guarantees that a prophet very much like Himself will be "raised up for you from among your own kin." He adds: "And to him you will listen." This is very much a command added to a promise.

Fast forward to this long ago day at the Capernaum synagogue. At the synagogue service, with its usual ritual begun with prayer, followed by Scripture readings and teaching. Just as Jesus started His teaching, He was rudely interrupted by a foul mouthed demon living in an otherwise innocent man who took on an even more ugly attitude. Jesus hears him out. "What have you to do with us Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us?" Most likely this group of demons knew the answer to their questions, but they wanted confirmation of their conclusion. It must have frightened the little congregation. Jesus doesn't answer their impertinent questions. Instead He commands them to be "Quiet! Come out of him!" That's the kind of thing that Moses had described long before coming from the future prophet.

The stupendous power of Jesus, able to cross over to the invisible world of the supernatural, should be a welcome comfort to us. Especially when we can be quite devilish in our inner lives. Christ has kept His promises. All we have to do is keep our own to Him. Allow me to tell, on a much lower level of example, what just might happen to us if we don't.

Three men died and went to heaven. Upon their arrival, St. Peter asked the first if he had been faithful to his wife. The man admitted to two affairs during his marriage. St. Peter told him that he could receive only a subcompact car to drive in heaven. Then St. Peter asked the second man if he had been faithful to his wife, and the man admitted to one affair. St. Peter told him that he could have a mid-size car to drive. The third man was asked about his faithfulness, and he told St. Peter he had been true to his wife until the day he died. St. Peter praised him and gave him a luxury car. A week later the three men were driving around, and they all stopped at a red light. The men in the subcompact and mid-size cars turned to see the man in the luxury car crying. They asked him what could possibly be the matter. After all, he was driving a luxury car. "I just passed my wife," he told them, "and she was on a skateboard!"

Saint of the Week

Agatha, Virgin and Martyr

Agatha is another of the early saints about whom most our knowledge is based on legend. She was born in Sicily, either Catania or Palermo, both of which claim her as a patron, and was martyred in Catania, most likely during the persecution of the Roman emperor Decius around the middle of the third century.

Agatha dedicated herself to God and a life of chastity. When she refused the advances of a Roman consul, he denounced her as a Christian and subjected her to torture and indignities to change her mind. But Agatha's continued dedication to God and her calm acceptance of torture only infuriated her captors and they had her tortured and killed.

Agatha's message today: Not many of us have to endure torture today, but all of us do bear distressing pain, whether physical, mental, or emotional, from time to time. Although this practice has been out of favor for a while, we might offer up our suffering to God in reparation for our sins.

Do you accept the sufferings that have come into your life with grace or do you tend to let everyone know that you are suffering?

"Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties." - 1 Corinthians 7:32

How much anxiety do we bring upon ourselves by constantly worrying about not having enough or attaining more things? God won't necessarily give you everything you want, but He will provide everything you need. Try this – use the word "pray" instead of the word "worry" in the future. Then pray for things instead of worrying about them.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear today's Gospel with its shouting demons, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Name some bad things that you want to pray that Jesus will take away from our world.

Question for Youth: Jesus was able to free the man from the unclean spirit within him. What do you hope Jesus will free you from? What is happening in the world that needs Jesus' help?

Question for Adults: What are the evils in today's world that you pray God will free us from?

MERCY CORNER




I have my demons; I'm sure you have yours. But we need not fear, because our unclean spirits don't stand a chance against the Good News of Jesus Christ. Grace and mercy and wholeness are ours for the taking, because he gives them to us, just as he gives himself for us.

Our experiences of restoration, of freedom from our personal demons, are not always as quick or dramatic as in today's Gospel reading; but they are no less life-changing. There is much Good News here for us today -- first, that we are not our demons. We are so much more than the ugliest parts of ourselves. Jesus sees us and knows us for who we really are -- precious creations of God. In our moments of greatest despair, when we feel utterly alone, when we can see no light at the end of our tunnels of struggle and sadness, we must remember that for us, just as for the man in the synagogue, Christ changes everything. Christ's authority is our refuge, our balm, and our strength. There are, of course, other great teachers and thinkers and leaders, others who have changed the world, others of importance and authority. But the authority of the Messiah, the authority on display that day in the synagogue, is unlike any other.
