Message from The Benjamin House

In the spirit of our friendship, I would like to share the troubles and joys of recent times.

We were busy looking for a small apartment adapted for a disabled person for our ward, Izabella Plaszynska. The girl has no father, disabled from birth, she stayed at Benjamin's home for over 12 years. In the Covid 19 lockdown, the House of Benjamin was closed and the children were taken to their families. Izabella remained on the street. Her mother, devastated by alcohol, lives with a man who refused to take Izabella home. Unfortunately, the mother did not stand up for her daughter. I couldn't let evil prevail.

We made a decision to buy a small, 29 square meter apartment for Izabella. She can cook herself and travel by bus. She is independent despite her disability.

A few days ago, with a religious rite, we handed over the apartment to Izabella - photos attached.

Life experience teaches us that evil is easy to do and that good requires many renunciations and sacrifices. We believe that this work inspired by the Gospel pleases the Lord Jesus, whom we adore during Lent. We made a difficult decision, we trust that we will have faith in God's Providence. We pray for health and long years of life for our friends associated with the parish of Fr. Robert from Lambertville, NJ.

Weekly Reflection

April 25, 2021

Fourth Sunday of Easter

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

The image we hear today of God's Son as "The Good Shepherd" persists in popularity and persuasive power. As a result, we can easily summon to mind that familiar painting or statue of a virile Christ shouldering a helpless lamb. Equally easy to think of ourselves as that needy creature, wordlessly longing for the solace that is our salvation.

It is interesting that the Greek word John uses for "good" in this instance means "ideal" or "noble," and not simply "good at."

This Sunday is "The World Day of Prayer for Vocations" by our Church. Obviously, you have noted the diminished number of priests and religious. Easy to ascribe that fact to the tired canard that such a life is against nature, or is just plain odd. It is good for those called. More serious claim for lesser numbers can be attributed to the scandals we have experienced. This is why I call today's seminarians and novices "heroes."

The Holy Spirit obviously wants to wake up the "sleeping giant" of lay participation in Church life to do even more. Yet the fact remains that our Church is built around the Holy Eucharist. Without the priest there is no Eucharist. But in this endeavor, we can never neglect or underestimate the power of prayer. That's what today is all about. We do have to beg the "Harvest master" for an increase in "field laborers."

Here is a story of one who said "yes" to his calling. Father Vincent Capodanno, a chaplain with the Marine Corps, was killed in battle on September 4, 1967 somewhere in the QueSon Valley in Vietnam. The last section of the official citation of the Congressional Medal of Honor, awarded posthumously, reads as follows:

Upon encountering a wounded corpsman in the direct line of fire of an enemy machine gunner positioned approximately fifteen yards away, Chaplain Capodanno rushed a daring attempt to aid and assist the mortally wounded corpsman. At that instant, only inches from his goal, he was struck down by a burst of machine gun fire.

By his heroic conduct on the battlefield, and his inspiring example, Lt. Capodanno upheld the finest tradition of the U.S. Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life in the cause of freedom."

Saint of the Week

James, Apostle and Martyr

A number of things can be inferred from the references to James in the gospels, together with tradition and what has been passed on in the writing of others. James was the son of Alphaeus. St. Paul tells us that Jesus made a special appearance to James prior to the Ascension. The other apostles were still suspicious of Paul when, three years after his conversion, he visited Jerusalem. But James, along with Peter, gave Paul a cordial welcome. Early writers tell us that James was stoned to death by the scribes and Pharisees who were afraid that, because of his influence with the people, he would bring all of Jerusalem to Christ. As he was being stoned, James knelt down and prayed for his tormentors.

James' message today: Like many other martyrs and like Jesus, James prayed for his persecutors. It is not easy loving those with whom we are in strong disagreement, but that is what Jesus asks us to do.

Have you forgiven your enemies or is your animosity still allowing them to rule your life? Ask Jesus to help you to learn to forgive those who have hurt you.

4th Sunday of Easter

"I am the good shepherd...and I lay down my life for the sheep...and they will heed my voice." - JOHN 10:14-16

When you pray, do you only ask Jesus for the things that you want? Do you ever ask Him what He wants from you? How do you listen for His response? Many times Jesus responds in "quiet whispers" that are not so obvious. So, take time every day, in silence, to actively listen for His voice.

MERCY CORNER

“Jesus Christ,” says Pope Francis “is the face of the Father’s mercy.” Christ, the Good Shepherd, is the face of a mercy that lifts us up from lowliness, that makes saints of sinners, that gives us hope for eternal joy in the presence of God. Christ is the Good Shepherd because in his mercy, he seeks us out when we are lost, and carries us to the safety and freedom of the Father’s love. Christ is the face of God’s mercy because his Church proclaims the meaning of our lives, and proclaims what is true, good, and beautiful.

We are blessed to see the face of Christ, the Good Shepherd, in the face of the good and holy priests who serve the universal Church, and who serve the Diocese of Metuchen. The Second Vatican Council wrote that priests are to “live as good shepherds that know their sheep, and they are to seek to lead those who are not of this sheepfold that they, too, may hear the voice of Christ, so that there might be one fold and one shepherd.” When priests commit their lives to imitating Christ, the Good Shepherd, they become faces of the Father’s mercy as well. Priests mediate mercy to the world—most especially in the sacrament of penance, and in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. And priests mediate mercy by teaching, by calling sinners to conversion, and by witnessing to Christ with their lives.

But good and holy priests are more than teachers, or witnesses. Good and holy priests are living martyrs for the Church of Jesus Christ.
