Please join us at St. John's every Monday morning at 8:00am for the Perpetual Novena in honor of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal.

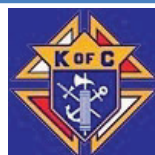

- ◆ Applicant must provide a 250 word essay in the body of a formal business letter. The essay should help the scholarship committee understand how the applicant has lived their Catholic Faith, in worship and service to the church and others. There are many awards for athletics and academics. The purpose of this award is to recognize the young man or woman who is striving to live the life of Christ.
- ◆ **All materials must be in the possession of the Scholarship committee by noon Monday, June 21, 2021. Please include your mailing address, email, and telephone number.**

The winners will be notified in the week of June 21st. The Scholarships will be presented at the 9:30 AM Mass on Sunday, June 27th, 2021.

Weekly Reflection

June 13, 2021

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

In the time of Our Lord, long before pen on paper was available to most people, and speech was the only medium of exchange of ideas, a good teacher had to use a special talent to get and keep the audience's attention. Our Lord, the Master teacher, made it look easy, St. Mark underscored this when he wrote what we hear today: "With many such parables He (Jesus) spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it." We can relate to a lesson of what a small seed planted can produce.

Mark augments that parable with the preceding one Jesus told about the power of the land to yield fruit. The Lord tells His first listeners and us that this is the way it is for God's kingdom. It is not a physical place, but a community of God's friends living His way. Church history chronicles how the Catholic Church has grown to embrace billions, even though it sprang from an unremarkable band of Twelve. This growth, fertilized and watered by the Holy Spirit, is only still here by His willing it. What has kept it alive ultimately traces back to God's design. The proof is in that very history, which could be called at times a record of human folly.

The prophet Ezekiel's image of a tender shoot planted atop a high mountain, and Jesus' picture of a tiny mustard seed planted in the earth tell us both of God's power and our own worth in His eyes. Each of us is an integral part of God's grand design, and Faith in Him helps us to believe it. We make a big mistake placing our faith elsewhere. But our cooperation with God can bring about something truly wonderful.

Sir Donald Malcolm Campbell, the British car and boat-racer and holder of several world speed records, lost his life while racing a fast boat on one of the lakes of Scotland. The boat exploded and rapidly sank. The only thing that ever surfaced was a toy stuffed animal, Campbell's alleged "good luck charm." The toy was powerless to help him in the final and fatal crisis of his life.

Very realistically, and in clear easy to understand language, there is no better demonstration of faith than a person planting seeds in a field. God love you, and give you His peace.

Saint of the Week

Anthony of Padua, Priest and Doctor

Born Ferdinand de Bulhoes in Lisbon, Portugal, Anthony was the son of a knight in King Alphonso's court. He began his studies at the cathedral in Lisbon and joined the Augustinians when he was fifteen. Ordained in about 1219, Anthony transferred to the Franciscans in 1221 at which time he took the name Anthony. He was a great preacher, who was renowned for drawing people to Christ through his words. He worked to abolish debtors' prisons, helped the poor, and worked ceaselessly and untiringly with those whose faith was weak. All of this took its toll on Anthony's health and he died on June 13 at the age of 36.

Anthony's message today: Anthony has been a favorite saint for hundreds of years because of the belief that he intercedes with God on behalf of many who have lost articles. Any Catholic who has, say, misplaced the car keys and said a short prayer to St. Anthony can tell you how they "miraculously" found their keys virtually "under their noses." We can count on the saints to help us, knowing that they, too, experienced many of the difficulties we encounter in our own lives.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: 2nd Cor 5:6-10

Step One: Listen to the Word

Listening today to this Scripture of encouragement, what strikes you about it? What word or phrase caught your ear today?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Have you ever had to walk in the dark with no light? How is that like walking by faith and not by sight? What did you have to do to keep going in the dark?

Question for Youth: Do you pray and ask for faith? How do you work on building your faith?

Question for Adults: When do you find it hardest to have faith? Must you "see" answered prayer, or can you peacefully accept God's will?

MERCY CORNER



The mustard seed –although tiny– is real and tangible. The point of the comparison is that faith must be more than a concept in your mind. It must produce results in your life –something real that you attribute to God's compassion for you.

As you journey through life, you can see that faith does the same things that seeds do. They grow into something much bigger than what they started. Your faith –trust in God– will also grow and you will be amazed by what He does with you. Does that mean that if you trust God to change something (take away the bad and bring on the good circumstances), that it will happen? No, moving the mountain is about taking away the fearful thoughts so that the circumstances are no longer something to dread. Circumstances will no longer control your life because you will trust God to do what is good for you –and for those around you.
