Reopening Plan Highlights

All Holy Trinity High School students will have the ability to attend school, in-person everyday.

Students will be divided into two separate cohorts. Students in each cohort will attend half of their classes in person each day and half of their classes remotely from a fixed location in the school building for the other half of the day.

This format will “flip” each day so that students will meet each of their teachers in-person every other day.

All students, with the exception of students who have been approved for the remote learning option, are expected to be in school each day for the entirety of the school day.

Resource Room students will be scheduled to attend classes in-person as much as possible regardless of cohort designation.



Reopening Plan Highlights

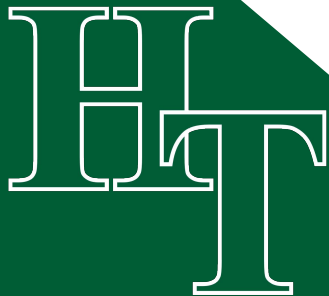
All Holy Trinity High School students will have the ability to attend school, in-person everyday.

The school schedule will remain intact: Homeroom will start at 7:55 am and 9th period will end at 2:40 pm.

Building will open to students at 7:15 am and close at 3:10 pm - No late buses.

Modifications to class dismissal and passing time will be made in order to provide for proper social distancing and disinfecting of spaces.

All curricula will continue to follow appropriate standards in order to prepare students for NYS Regents Exams, AP Exams and SAT.



Reopening Plan Highlights

A Remote Learning Option will be available for students.

Form is available on the school website and must be completed by Friday August 21st.

Students who declare “Remote” are committed to that option for the duration of the first quarter; Students who attend “In-Person” can opt to switch to Remote.

Health Protocols

Daily attestation of individual health - Provided by DRVC

Temperature checks will be required for all students.

Anyone whose temperature is above 100 degrees fahrenheit will be isolated immediately in a special designated area.

Additional Covid-19 testing and Contact Tracing will be conducted in accordance with the Nassau County Department of Health guidelines.

All decisions regarding dismissal, isolation, quarantine, and closure will come from the DoH and DRVC based on the facts

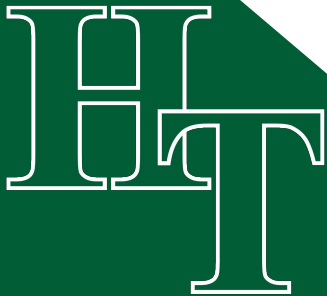
Face Coverings

All students, faculty, staff, and visitors will be required to wear a CDC-approved face covering whenever they are moving about the building.

Neck gaiters, open chin triangle bandanas, and costume masks are not allowed. Student face coverings must be of a solid color may not include any logos or images other than an HT.

NYS Guidelines allow for students to remove their face coverings if they are seated at their desk in a classroom or eating in the cafeteria provided appropriate social distancing is maintained.

Faculty may remove masks at their discretion while instruction is taking place, provided appropriate social distancing is maintained.



Health and Safety

Building Protocols

All hallways will flow in a one-way directional pattern.

Markings throughout the building will remind students to maintain proper social distancing.

Desks in classrooms will be arranged that every student is at least six feet away from every other student.

Classroom windows will be left open whenever weather conditions permit.

Classrooms will be provided with hand sanitizer and additional cleaning supplies.

All commonly used spaces will be sanitized throughout the day.

The school will be thoroughly cleaned after school.



Cafeteria and Food Service

Lessings, Inc.

Students will be seated in socially-distant desks in the cafeteria, separated by cohorts.

Pre-ordering of lunch is strongly encouraged through the Lessings EZ Pay system.

All meals will be boxed and sealed; contactless pick-up will occur in an ordered way.

Cash will be accepted only at designated location, subject to CDC guidelines.

Students may bring their own lunch. Vending machines are available.

Cafeteria will be sanitized following each lunch period and thoroughly cleaned after school each day.



Important Information

As per NYSCHSAA all athletics at Holy Trinity are currently paused until September 21, 2020.

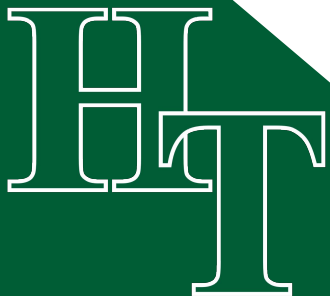
All extracurricular and after school activities are also paused until that date.

All large assemblies, events, and field trips will be on pause until further notice.

Guidance Department, Social Worker, and Campus Ministry team will be available as they would be during the normal functioning of the school. Students will be required to make appointments ahead of time via email.

Building access will be limited. Parents are encouraged to avoid dropping off student belongings during the school day and must schedule meetings when they need to conduct business at the school.

Anyone entering the school building must use the Cherry Lane entrance and wear a mask at all times.
