The information below is for your review. There are no questions to be answered.

NY State Law: Junior Driver (Permit and Junior License)

- supervising driver: age 21 or older
- If you are under age 18, you must wait at least 6 months from the date you received your learner permit to schedule your road test.
- You may not drive with a learner permit on any street within a park in New York City or on any bridge or tunnel under the jurisdiction of the Tri-borough Bridge and Tunnel Authority on the Cross County, Hutchinson River, Saw Mill River, or Taconic State parkways in Westchester County or in a DMV road test area
- 5 am - 9 pm
- Practice: 50/15
- If you have passed a road test and have a **junior license** (Class DJ, MJ or DJ/MJ), you may drive in Nassau and Suffolk counties between the hours of 6 AM and 9 PM without a supervising driver **only directly between your home and your employment** (you must carry appropriate proof of employment). You may not drive to school.

Distracted Driving Penalties for probationary and junior drivers with a Class DJ or MJ driver license or learner permit:

The first conviction of a cell phone use or texting violation will result in a **suspension** of the driver license or permit for 120 days.

A second conviction within six months of the restoration of the license or permit (after the 120 day suspension is terminated) will result in a **revocation** of at least one year of a probationary license, or a **revocation** of at least one year for a Class DJ or MJ driver license or learner permit.
