Baptisms: Diocesan policy requires parents to attend a Baptismal preparation course. At least one Godparent must be Catholic ; at least 16 yrs. of age ; have received the sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation; and if married, be validly married in the Church and be able to receive Holy Communion, the other may be a Christian witness. Please contact the parish office for more details.

Adults for Confirmation: If you are an adult who made your First Communion but was never confirmed. A class for adults needing the Sacrament of Confirmation will be taught by Father DuPré . For more information contact the parish office.

Marriages: Contact Pastor (6) six months prior to the expected date to begin preparations.

Anointing of the Sick: A Family Member needs to call the office to arrange a visit from the Pastor to the Home or Hospital.

Funerals: The Funeral Director must contact the parish office on behalf of the family. The Viewing / visitation of the dearly departed will no longer be allowed prior to a Funeral Mass or Memorial Mass in the Church or Chapel. The family will have to acquire the facility of the Funeral Home in charge of handling the arrangements.

St. Padre Pio Relics



The relics of St. Pio of Pietrelcina, affectionately known to Catholics as Padre Pio, are on tour in the United States and will make a stop in the Diocese of Lafayette. Padre Pio's relics will be at Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Church in Lafayette on Sunday, October 6, 2019.

To begin the day-long event, Bishop Douglas Deshotel will celebrate Mass in honor of Saint Pio at 9 a.m. inside the church. Veneration of the Relics will be from 10 a.m. until 6:30 p.m. in Knight Hall, right behind the church and to the right of Our Lady of Fatima School. While Veneration is underway in Knight Hall, the 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. Masses will be celebrated inside the church, as usual. The relics of Saint Pio available for public veneration include Saint Pio's glove, crusts of the wounds, cotton-gauze with his blood stains, a lock of his hair, Saint Pio's mantle, and his handkerchief soaked with his sweat hours before he died.

Each relic is encased in an elegant reliquary, which will be displayed for prayers and veneration. The faithful who visit will be allowed close enough to touch the reliquaries holding the saint's effects.
