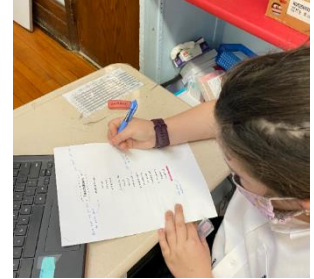

professionally printed and enlarged to be put on display for CSW!

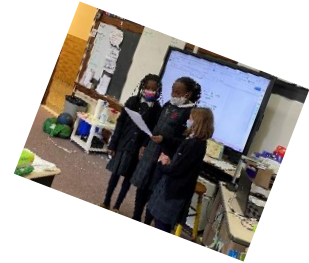

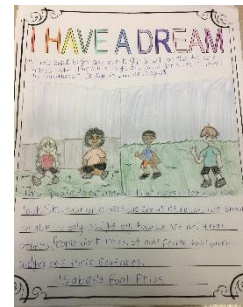
