Mass—Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Entrance Antiphon: Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, / and there is none that can resist your will. / For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, / and all that is held within the circle of heaven; / you are the Lord of all.

1st Reading, from the Book of Genesis 2:18-24

The Lord God said: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a suitable partner for him." So the Lord God formed out of the ground various wild animals and various birds of the air, and he brought them to the man to see what he would call them; whatever the man called each of them would be its name. The man gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of the air, and all wild animals; but none proved to be the suitable partner for the man.

So the Lord God cast a deep sleep on the man, and while he was asleep, he took out one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. The Lord God then built up into a woman the rib that he had taken from the man. When he brought her to the man, the man said: / "This one, at last, is bone of my bones / and flesh of my flesh; / this one shall be called 'woman,' / for out of 'her man' this one has been taken." That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh.

2nd Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews

Brothers and sisters: He "for a little while" was made "lower than the angels," that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

For it was fitting that he, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the leader to their salvation perfect through suffering. He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin. Therefore, he is not ashamed to call them "brothers."

Gospel, a reading from according to Mark

[The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, "Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?" They were testing him. He said to them in reply, "What did Moses command you?" They replied, "Moses permitted a husband to write a bill of divorce and dismiss her." But Jesus told them, "Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." In the house the disciples again questioned Jesus about this. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery."]

And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Then he embraced them and blessed them, placing his hands on them.

Mission Statement: Rooted in our Catholic Faith and enriched by our diverse community, Trinity Catholic School fosters spiritual development, academic excellence, responsibility to self, and service to others.

Dear Generous Donor:

On behalf of the Trinity Catholic School students and faculty, I would like to thank you for allowing me this opportunity to tell you more about our community of faith and learning. As you know, Trinity is a small parochial school located in the West-Central and Emerson-Garfield neighborhoods of Spokane. Our families make the choice and commitment for their children to receive an education centered around church teachings and academic excellence. This commitment is a sacrifice for many of our families. Currently, Trinity serves 68 families with 99 students in kindergarten through eighth grade. Of these 68 families, 62 receive some form of tuition assistance through our fair share program.

Fundraising events such as our annual auction, help us to provide these families with tuition assistance. Full tuition is \$5700 per year. Families apply for tuition assistance and participate in the process to determine financial need. Our fundraisers help to bridge the gap between the cost of education and a family's ability to pay. Since the majority of our families require assistance, our gap is rather large. We ask that you help us bridge the gap with a donation to our auction. Your donation is tax deductible (Tax ID #91-1427985), and helps to continue a Catholic education for a number of families.

Trinity Catholic School has a very diverse population. Over 65% of our students qualify for and receive benefits for free or reduced priced school lunch. 33% of our students are non-white, including Hispanic, African-American, and Asian children. Nation-wide, the high school graduation rate of students in Catholic schools is 99%. Trinity's statistics are consistent with the national numbers. Our students achieve great things beyond the walls of Trinity. Some of our recent success stories include a Broadway star, a Microsoft executive, educators, an engineer, an event planner, an author, and countless others who serve their community.

The feeling of community is very strong at Trinity. Many of our alumni choose to return for the education of their own children. This is our greatest success story. In knowing that we had a meaningful impact on a student who wished the same for his/her own children, our mission and philosophy are affirmed.
