



Why now?

Many factors lead us to recognize an urgent need to organize parish life more effectively for our future. We face the decline of religious practice in the United States and changing demographics in the Midwest. And, while we are blessed with an increased number of men who have been ordained to the priesthood in the past few years or who are currently in seminary formation, we have even more still serving as pastors who are at or beyond retirement age or who will be eligible to retire in the next few years. We must address this situation through thoughtful strategic and pastoral planning in order to form vital parishes that lead us all to embrace Christ and the call to missionary discipleship.¹

BEACONS of LIGHT: From Surviving to Thriving

Beacons of Light will be a unique experience of pastoral planning for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. There are two essential elements of the process, which will take place simultaneously and will lead us to move from maintenance to mission, from surviving to thriving. **Strategic Planning:** involves data gathering, analysis, and the identification of the best possible parish groupings throughout the Archdiocese. **Pastoral Planning:** includes meetings and processes through which parish leaders will discern the shape of parish life for their grouping and create a pastoral plan for the future.
