20 + C + M + B + 21

The Epiphany marks the occasion of a timehonored Christian tradition of "chalking the doors." The formula for the ritual — adapted for 2021 — is simple: (1) take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 21. (Maybe write on a chalk-painted board and hang it near your entrance.) The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar— who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house." The "+"signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "21" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is a request for Christ to bless our homes this year of 2021. If you want Fr. David to come and bless your home and "chalk the doors" of your house, please call (937) 683-1201 to schedule it.
