Fifth Sunday of Easter

Dear Friends in Christ,

“Alleluia! Alleluia! Let the Holy Anthem Rise” is how the hymn authored by Sir Edward Caswall begins. He was born in 1814, at Yatley, in Hampshire, where his father was a clergyman of the Anglican Church. In 1832, he went to Brasenose College, Oxford, and in 1836, took a second-class in classics. In 1838, he was ordained Deacon, and in 1839, Priest, all in the Anglican Church. In 1847, he joined into full communion with the holy Roman Catholic Church. Finally, in 1850, he was admitted into the Congregation of the Oratory at Birmingham, (known as the Oratorians). We have an oratory in Cincinnati at Old St. Mary’s Church which is associated with the Birmingham Oratory. Sir Caswall wrote many original poems and hymns while at the Oratory and when he died in 1878 his funeral was presided over by his close friend Cardinal Henry Newman.

This Song possesses a triumphant and marching tune, as typically played by most musicians. In this first stanza of lyrics, we are invited to join the angels and saints singing the “Alleluia” in heavenly skies. We are invited to see a glorious communion of heaven and earth in this song of “mountains” and “valleys” where this Alleluia resounds. The second stanza is particularly focused on the light of Christ’s resurrection and why we too share in this great Alleluia that darkness is no more with the Risen Lord in our song. The third stanza is sobering in that as we rejoice, we also know that Jesus Christ, who knew no sin, was made to suffer sin so that we might be saved from our loss of heaven through sin. The final stanza is a heartfelt plea that Christ will one day take us to himself. That one day, the last day, Christ will be fully revealed with trumpet blast and Alleluia songs as the Risen Lord of all.

A question to ponder with this song:
How do I let the great “Alleluia” resound in my thoughts, heart, and actions this week?
