

# Cereal Box Book Report Project

- Wrap the cereal box in any kind of colored, textured, or pattern paper you wish.
   Remember to be creative. You may use a variety of supplies (glitter, stickers, etc.) to make your box more interesting.
- 2. Decorate the front of the box with the title of the book and the author's name. Then create a picture on the front of the box that symbolizes the book and advertises the book as exciting!
- 3. Use the template for the right side of the box to list the characters and the setting of the story.
- 4. Use the template for the left side of the box to write a brief description of the book. Your description should persuade others to read your book.
- 5. Use the template for the top of the box to rate the book on five stars.
- 6. On the back of the cereal box, create a fun game or activity based on the book. An example would be a word find or a maze.
- 7. Place a prize inside of your box. This can be a little toy or trinket that represents a part of your book in some way.

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Concluding prayer (Repeat 3 times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

#### St. Michael Prayer

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.
