In-Person

- All students will return, but students will remain in their homerooms for the duration of the day and the teachers
 will come to them, with the exceptions:
 - Music (which may be in the main church)
 - Gym (which may be in the gym or outdoors)
 - Science Lab. In those cases the rooms will be sanitized after each use.
 - Classes such as Spanish, Art, Technology, Library, and Religion will all come to the homerooms of the students.
- To ensure safety during lunch the cafeteria, gym, or classrooms may be utilized.
- All movement throughout the school will be in a single file. Arrows will indicate the flow of movement.
- Recess will be either outside or in the classrooms depending on the weather.

In-Person

- Teachers will use the Google Classroom platform and Google Suite. Other platforms may be used to enhance student success and/or engagement.
- A process will be made to provide students with Chromebooks to borrow and to be returned upon the completion
 of the academic year.

Remote

- Teachers will use the Google Classroom platform and Google Suite. Other platforms may be used to enhance student success and/or engagement.
- A modified schedule for grades K-grade 3 and a bell schedule for grades 4-8 will be used.
- Classes will be expected to meet daily via Google Meet.
- We are working to offer 1:1 technology.
- Teachers and students will receive instruction and training in the use of digital learning platforms.

Remote: Operational Criteria

- The same academic standards and requirements are applied to programs offered on campus and through online learning.
- Online learning programs are coherent, complete, and offered in a sequence or configuration that allows timely completion of requirements.
- Faculty members are responsible for the initial and ongoing development and delivery of instruction in on-line programs.
- Teachers provide appropriate and flexible interaction between faculty and students and among students.
- Distance learning programs include adequate verification of learners' work.
- Attendance would be taken for each session.

Questions for Saint Anne's Students Before They Go to School

- Does your child currently have a temperature of over 100.0 degrees?
- In the past 24 hours, has your child experienced:
 - Fever
 - Fatigue
 - Frequent Dry Cough
 - Aches and Pains
 - Sore Throat
 - Diarrhea
 - Headaches
 - Shortness of Breath
 - Loss of Smell or Taste
- Has your child recently been in close contact with anyone who has exhibited any of these symptoms?
- Has your child been in close or proximate contact in the past 14 days with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or who has had symptoms of COVID-19?
- Has the student traveled recently from a state or country where New York State is requiring a 14 day quarantine upon return to New York State?

Temperature

- Each person entering the school will have their temperature checked before being allowed to enter. Persons
 with a confirmed temperature equal to or exceeding 100.0 degrees will be denied entry to St Anne's School.
- Surface thermometers will be used to check temperatures of anyone entering the building.
- Faculty and staff will complete a daily form to confirm that they are healthy and in compliance with all NYS
 guidelines and executive orders. (including recent travel to restricted areas with high rates of COVID-19)

Mask Usage

- All students, faculty, staff, and visitors will be required to wear a CDC-approved face covering whenever they
 are moving about the building or in classroom.
- Neck gaiters, open chin triangle bandanas, and costume masks are not allowed.
- Student face coverings must be of a solid color and may not include any logos besides the St. Anne's School logo.
- Mask breaks will be scheduled during the day.
- Students will have a 6-foot distance during lunch so they can remove masks.
- All adults who enter the building must supply and wear a cloth mask or face covering that covers their nose and mouth.
- Students are asked to supply their own mask or face covering. We will maintain a supply of extra masks for students.
