We had a busy first full week of school! The children are doing a great job following our routines and rules. I am so proud of the way they have adjusted to all the changes COVID has brought.

In ELA, we have been working on sequencing the events of a story, identifying the subject and predicate of a sentence and adding details to make our writing more interesting and informative.

Our story of the week was *Henry and Mudge*. Ask your child to tell you about it.

We have been reviewing addition and subtraction, odd/even numbers and skip counting in math and will continue with more review this week. The children will be completing assessments (ungraded) each day to see what they remember from the 1st grade math curriculum. This will help guide me in planning.

In Science, we have been working on ways to keep ourselves safe and healthy and learning facts about germs.

Last Thursday was Constitution Day. The students worked on mini books and wrote their own law that they would like to have added to the Constitution.

The theme of last week's gospel was forgiveness. We watched the parable of "The Unforgiving Servant" and also completed Chapter 1: Our Church Welcomes Us in our religion books.
