



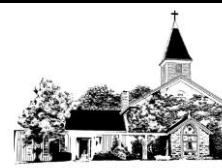

Blessed Among Us: St. Peregrine

Peregrine Laziosi (1265-1345) was born in Forli, Italy, the only son of wealthy parents. At that time, Forli was governed by the Pope as part of the Papal States. He grew up in a family which was actively involved in the anti-papal party and he was a stronghold of anti-papal party activism.

Mass and the Sacraments could not be celebrated in the city. St. Philip Benizi, Prior General of the Servants of Mary was sent to Forli to preach reconciliation of the city and removal of the penalty. Peregrine hassled Philip and knocked him down with a nasty blow to the face, then immediately repented for having done so and asked for forgiveness. He joined the Servants of Mary at age 30.

He returned to Forli to spend the rest of his life, not a as priest but a choir brother. He dedicated himself to the sick, the poor and those on the fringe of society. Eventually he developed varicose veins from his own harsh penance of standing whenever it wasn't necessary to sit. He developed an open running sore on his leg, diagnosed as cancer. The wound grew so large that the leg was scheduled for amputation.

On the night before the surgery, Peregrine, age 60, prayed before the image of the crucified Christ, fell into a deep trance-like sleep in which he envisioned the crucified Christ leaving the cross and touching his cancerous leg. When he awakened from the trance, the wound had healed and the leg was saved.

Peregrine lived 20 more years and died on May 1, 1345 at 80. He was canonized on Dec. 27, 1726. He was named the Patron Saint of those who suffer from cancer. His feast day is May 4. (This article was requested by a parishioner)
