Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

This Wednesday, January 22 is the anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade court decision that legalized abortion in 1973. On this Annual Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, the U.S. Bishops have instructed us to pray for the protection of the unborn and to do penance for acts of abortion.

According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373 states: “In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.”

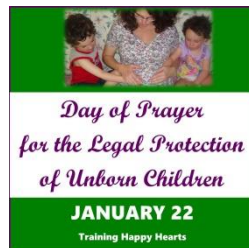
“Let us join with the Bishops in prayer and penance, imploring God’s mercy upon our nation and the world for this terrible crime, and invoking Our Lady’s aid in bringing an end to abortion and the culture of death and restoring a culture of life.” [The Missive, Jan. 22, ‘18]

And from St. John Paul II’s Farewell Address, apostolic journey to the U.S. 1987:

“America, your deepest identity and truest character as a nation is revealed in the position you take towards the human person. The ultimate test of your greatness is the way you treat every human being, but especially the weakest and most defenseless ones. The best traditions of your land presume respect for those who cannot defend themselves. If you want equal justice for all, and true freedom and lasting peace, then, America, defend life! All the great causes that are yours today will have meaning only to the extent that you guarantee the right to life and protect the human person...”
