



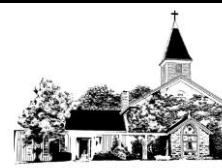

Tower and Stone Restoration Project at St. Cyril's Church

The Laying of the Corner Stone of St. Cyril of Alexandria Church took place on June 18, 1922 with Bishop J. H. Conroy of Ogdensburg and Father M. E. Fogarty and the Trustees, Mr. C. H. Hunt and Mr. J. H. Farrell officiating. That was 98 years ago and you can see the Corner Stone to the right of the Chapel entrance of St. Cyril's.

In recent years moisture problems have become very apparent in the church. As you know, last summer we embarked on phase 1 of the restoration of the mortar, precast stonework and flashing on the north and east side of the tower. At that time plans were made for phase 2, addressing the west side of the tower this year. That will take place in September and involve scaffolding around the chapel doors.

After examining the structure, in 2021 that work will continue on the south side of the tower, along with Turret Repair on the left front of the church in phase 3. Buttresses will also be addressed at that time.

Finally, in 2022 with phase 4 there will be Turret Restoration on the south west elevation and the south west portion of the tower.

Lupine Construction of Utica, NY is doing the work. The members of the Finance Council have studied the proposals. I will be consulting members of the Pastoral Council as well, and approval will be sought from the Diocese.
