



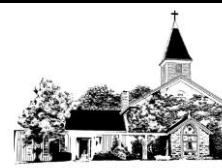

WORLD SMILE DAY

WORLD SMILE DAY is the first Friday of the month; this year it was October 2. Although it has passed, the idea and sentiment is meant for every day. It is a relatively new secular holiday with a fascinating story. Created by a commercial artist named Harvey Ball, the day came about as a response to his creation of the Smiley Face. These little yellow faces are more than just a symbol, they are a statement about the power of smiling.

In 1963, Harvey Ball from Worcester, Massachusetts, created the Smiley Face symbol that we all know. It exploded into the world of popular culture, becoming one of the most well-known symbols in the world. It appeared in the movie, "Forest Gump" and used as a motif in the novel, Watchmen.

When one says, Smiley Face, most people think of that yellow face with the dot black eyes and simple curve for a smile (although the original face's smile was more elongated). It went on to symbolize good will and good cheer, knowing no politics, no geography and no religion. But Harvey became concerned that the over-commercialization of his symbol would lose its original meaning of good will and good cheer.

Thus Harvey decided on a World Smile Day®. He wanted each of us throughout the world to devote one day a year to smiles and acts of kindness. He chose the first Friday of October to serve this purpose. In 1999, World Smile Day® became an official holiday...the day to encourage people to smile and make small acts of kindness worldwide. His idea was that one would smile and in return, that would make someone else smile...brightening the day of both.

Everyone can make a difference on World Smile Day® just by being compassionate, caring and helping those around them have the best day they can have. Missed the actual day? Not a problem as this day can be celebrated over and over 365 days a year.

St. Mother Teresa was very fond of smiles and referred to them frequently. The following quotes are attributed to her:

"Peace begins with a smile."

"Every time you smile at someone, it is an act of love, a gift to that person, a beautiful thing."

"Let us always meet each other with smile, for the smile is the beginning of love."

"Smile at each other. Smile at your wife, smile at your husband, smile at your children, smile at each other-it doesn't matter who it is-and that will help to grow up in greater love for each other."

There are hundreds of languages around the world, but a smile speaks them all.
