



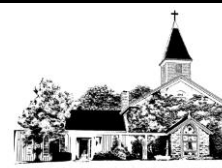

### **POPE ST. JOHN XXIII by Judy Pearson**

"On October 28, 1958, a new pope greeted the Church from the balcony overlooking St. Peter's Square. There stood the smiling, rotund figure of Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli, the son of peasants and recently the patriarch of Venice. 'I am called John,' he said." [From Blessed Among Us]

John XXIII was the 260<sup>th</sup> successor of St. Peter, serving as pope from October 1958 to June 1963. He was born on November 25, 1881 the fourth of 13 children to a family of sharecroppers in Sotto il Monte, Italy. He entered the seminary in Bergamo at age 12. In 1901 he went to Rome to further his studies, took a year off for military service, then went to Rome to finish his studies. He was ordained on August 10, 1904 at age 23, serving as secretary to the bishop of Bergamo. His life was full, serving in both WWI and WWII, being named an archbishop in 1925 and then a cardinal in 1953 before being called to Rome and becoming, at age 76, the oldest pope to be elected in more than 200 years.

About his choice of John as his name he said "I choose John... a name sweet to us because it is the name of our father, dear to me because it is the name of the humble parish church where I was baptized, the solemn name of numberless cathedrals scattered throughout the world, including our own basilica [St. John Lateran]." When he chose the name, there was some confusion as to whether he would be known as John XXIII or John XXIV; in response, he declared that he was John XXIII, thus affirming the antipapal status of antipope John XXIII.

John XXIII, one of the best-loved of all the popes, died on June 3, 1963.. On December 3, 1963 President Johnson posthumously awarded him the Presidential Medal of Freedom for mediating between President Kennedy and Khrushchev during the Cuban Missile Crisis in late 1962. He is best known for convening the Second Vatican Council on October 11, 1962. Pope St. John XXIII was canonized on April 27, 2014 by Pope Francis.

His feast day is October 11. It is not on the day of his death, as is usual, but assigned the date of the first session of the Second Vatican Council by Pope John Paul II.
