



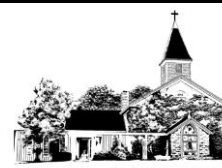

THE FOURTEEN HOLY HELPERS

During the devastating period of the Black Death (1346-1349) in Europe, the deadliest pandemic recorded in human history, over 50 million people died. There were many saints the people invoked against this plague and sudden death. Among those were the Fourteen Holy Helpers, a group of saints venerated together in Roman Catholicism because their intercession is believed to have been particularly effective, especially against various diseases.

Devotion to the fourteen "Auxiliary Saints" began in Rhineland. All have remarkable stories and lives and all but one died a martyr. Popular veneration of these saints (11 men and 3 women) often began in a monastery that held their relics. These saints are:

- **St. George**, a victim of the Diocletian persecution. He is invoked against diseases of the skin and palsy.
- **St. Blaise**, arrested by order of Emperor Licinius. He is invoked against disease of the throat.
- **St. Aegidius (Giles)**, lived a monastic life and is invoked against crippling diseases. He lived a long life, the only one of the fourteen who did not die a martyr.
- **St. Denis**, the earliest and most renowned of the Fourteen because he was converted by St. Paul. Denis is invoked against demonic assault.
- **St. Eustace**, the next earliest, was martyred under Emperor Trajan and invoked for protection against fire, temporal and eternal.
- **St. Erasmus**, is invoked against stomach disorders. He is the patron of sailors and St. Elmo's fire is named after him.
- **St. Cyriacus**, a Roman Deacon persecuted under Diocletian, is invoked against eye diseases.
- **St. Christopher**, a convert beheaded for his faith, is invoked for safe travels and sudden death.
- **St. Vitus**, another victim of Diocletian persecution, is invoked against paralysis, nervous diseases and epilepsy.
- **St. Pantaleon**, Christian physician put to death by Emperor Maximin, is invoked against lung diseases.
- **St. Acatius**, beheaded under Diocletian, is invoked against headaches.
- **St. Barbara**, slain by her father because of her belief in Christ, is invoked against lightning and explosions.
- **St. Catherine of Alexandria**, beheaded by Maximin, is the patron of philosophers and invoked against lawsuits.
- **St. Margaret**, tortured and killed by the prefect, Alybrius for rebuking his offer of marriage, is invoked against kidney diseases.

While each had a separate feast day, the Fourteen Holy Helpers were in some places celebrated as a group on August 8, but this celebration never became part of the General Roman Calendar for universal veneration.
