## WORLD DAY OF PEACE 2021

On January 1, we celebrate not only The Feast of Mary, The Mother of God, but also the 54<sup>th</sup> World Day of Peace, established by Pope St. Paul VI on December 8, 1967. It was then that Pope St. Paul VI dedicated the Solemnity of Mary to world peace, and each feast since 1968 has seen release of a papal message. [This year's message](#) is the latest in a long tradition of messages for this day that began with Pope [St. Paul VI](#) in 1967, and continued with Pope [St. John Paul II](#), [Pope Benedict XVI](#), and [Pope Francis](#).

In the first World Day of Peace (WDP) on January 1, 1968, Pope Paul explained the purpose of this special day, opening his message with these words: *"We address Ourselves to all men of good will to exhort them to celebrate 'The Day of Peace', throughout the world, on the first day of the year, January 1, 1968. It is Our desire that then, every year, this commemoration be repeated as a hope and as a promise, at the beginning of the calendar which measures and outlines the path of human life in time, that Peace with its just and beneficent equilibrium may dominate the development of events to come."*

The [Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy](#) further explains, *"The Holy See shares the profound aspirations of man for peace. Since 1967, 1 January has been designated 'world day for peace'.*

*Popular piety has not been oblivious to this initiative of the Holy See. In the light of the new born Prince of Peace, it reserves this day for intense prayer for peace, education towards peace and those values inextricably linked with it, such as liberty, fraternal solidarity, the dignity of the human person, respect for nature, the right to work, the sacredness of human life, and the denunciation of injustices which trouble the conscience of man and threaten peace."*

The title for this year's message by Pope Francis is **"Good Politics is at the Service of Peace"** explaining how we can use our political and social systems to seek peace, stating that "politics is one of the highest forms of charity."

NOTE: Peace will be the theme for all the January bulletins. What better way to start a new year...especially with all that has occurred in 2020...than with PEACE.
