


Stay Safe, Stay Well. Cold and flu season is approaching, along with the current Covid pandemic. Here are a few reminders about attending Mass or any parish gathering.

- If you have any symptoms of illness such as head or body aches, cough, sinus, fever, or may have been exposed to someone who is ill, please stay home. The Catechism of the Catholic Church #2181 reminds us that "illness" is one of the serious reasons for which participation in Mass can be excused.
- The unvaccinated are required to wear masks, but all are welcome to.
- Distancing is encouraged. Masks should be worn when not able to distance.
- Hand sanitizers are available.

Deacon's Corner by Dc. Bruce Daugherty

We used to have a "Deacon's bench" in our home, but someone said they liked it and my wife quickly gave it to them! Thinking about that Deacon's bench, I had to look up more information and this is what I found. I did do some copying here, just so you know I did not make this up! Thanks to Christianity Stack Exchange.com for the help.

"Deacon's bench" is a somewhat modern terminology for a specific type of bench. In fact, the first known usage of this phrase dates back to about 1922. Thus, it cannot be claimed as a tradition in any stretch of the imagination, ecclesiastical or secular." OK, now we know this is a young term.

"A kind of bench whose hinged seat is also the lid of an enclosed storage compartment." Now we know that we should be storing something in this bench. These benches are in actuality not designed for the exclusive usage of deacons in the Catholic Church, but are for storing the books required for the service of the altar or chapter house. Just as deacons are ordained for the service of the altar and aiding the priest in celebrating the Divine Mysteries at the altar.

Deacon benches in the actual church would store the missal, the lectionary, and the breviary. In monastic chapter houses, the deacon's bench would contain the Martyrology, and the Rule of St. Benedict, as well as other books pertaining to the monastic customs and the declarations (and norms) of the particular Congregation in question.

In other words, the deacon's bench contains all the books necessary for any and all liturgical functions in either the church, cathedral, or chapter.

A deacon may not be a storehouse of all things...after all none of us is getting any younger...but deacons do have a wealth of knowledge. Our ministry is to serve others, a ministry of service. Deacons serve in many capacities at liturgies, such as preparing the altar table, as lector, or even as an altar server. Deacons serve in parish ministries, such as adult education. Sometimes even our career skills serve the parishes, such as a counselor or carpenter. Sometimes you may even find a deacon serving up food at the next parish social function!

**Black and Indian Mission Collection
This Weekend, November 20-21**

Ever since the first collection in 1884, the national **Black and Indian Mission Collection** has reflected the generosity of the good People of God and has enabled the Commission to give helpful grants to dioceses across the country to operate schools, parishes, and other missionary services that build the Body of Christ in Native American, Alaska Native, and Black Catholic communities. Our own Diocese of Ogdensburg has benefitted from this collection. Please be generous.

Christ gives us his Body in the Eucharist, he gives himself in his Body and thus makes us his Body, he unites us with his Risen Body. If man eats ordinary bread, in the digestive process this bread becomes part of his body, transformed into a substance of human life. But in holy Communion the inverse process is brought about. Christ, the Lord, assimilates us into himself, introducing us into his glorious Body, and thus we all become his Body.
