FAITH FORMATION

Family Discussion: Jesus' statement that no prophet is accepted in his home town reminds us that it is often difficult to hear a challenging message from those who know us best, even if it is true. Perhaps we remember and even regret this aspect of our childhood and adolescence. We may have overlooked the wisdom and guidance of our parents, while allowing the voices of others—teachers, friends, and counselors—to carry more weight, even when these people were telling us the same thing. Perhaps this developmental stage is unavoidable. Perhaps as we have matured, we have come to a new appreciation for our parents and others whose perspective and experience we once rejected. Today's Gospel provides an opportunity to talk about and to learn from such experiences.

As you gather as a family, consider proverbs or other wise sayings that are familiar to your family ("Blood is thicker than water;" "All that glitters is not gold."). Consider what these proverbs mean and whether you believe them to be true. Why or why not? Jesus challenges the people of Nazareth by reminding them of old sayings that seem to have a lot of truth in them. Let's listen to this Gospel and consider what these proverbs mean. Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 4:21-30. Ask: What were the proverbs that Jesus quoted? (Physician, cure yourself; No prophet is accepted in his native place.) Consider the meaning of these proverbs and look for examples from your own family life that show their truth. Consider how your family might accept one another's wisdom and guidance and not reject the prophets in your midst. Conclude by praying together the [Prayer to the Holy Spirit](#).

Theme: Jesus is rejected in his hometown Nazareth.

Summary: At the beginning of today's Gospel, we see that the people in Jesus' hometown think of him very highly. But then, all of a sudden, they become enraged with him. Jesus' intent is to carry on with his ministry of making the love of God known and inviting everyone to enter into a close relationship with God.

Jesus proclaims good news to the people who desperately needed words of hope, compassion, and love. This Gospel parallels the first reading in that even though prophets speaking of God's love are often misunderstood, God's message must still be made known to all people.

Scripture: *"How can this be?" they asked. "Isn't this Joseph's son?"* **Luke 4:21-30**

In the day that Jesus lived, many people had a hard time believing some of the things that they heard about him. This was especially true of the people in his hometown of Nazareth. People had heard about the miracles that Jesus had done in Capernaum and they just didn't know how they could be true. After all, wasn't he Joseph's son? How could the son of a carpenter do all of the things that they had heard about?

Jesus said to them, "Surely you will quote this proverb to me: 'Physician, heal yourself! Do here in your hometown what we have heard that you did in Capernaum.' I tell you the truth," he continued, "no prophet is accepted in his hometown.

The people in the synagogue became furious. They got up, drove him out of the town, and took him up on the hill on which the town was built, because they wanted to throw him off of a cliff.

But he walked right through the crowd and went on his way.

Heavenly Father, even when others refuse to believe that Jesus has the power to heal and forgive, help us to remain faithful and true. In the name of Jesus we pray. Amen

La Paradoja de los Profetas

Es paradójico en la vida de los profetas que ellos anuncian un bien, la voluntad de Dios, y son tratados como malhechores. Esto llega a convertirse en un sello característico de la vida de ellos, hasta el punto de que en algún pasaje Nuestro Señor anuncia: "Bienaventurados seréis cuando os insulten y persigan, y digan todo género de mal contra vosotros falsamente, por causa de mí. Regocijaos y alegraos, porque vuestra recompensa en los cielos es grande, porque así persiguieron a los profetas que fueron antes que vosotros" (Mateo 5,11-12).

Por supuesto, esa dureza que enfrentan los profetas es una dura prueba que implica soledad, burlas, y en los casos peores, persecución, tortura y muerte. Es bueno recordar que al frente de toda esa lista de testigos insignes va precisamente Jesucristo, a quien la iglesia saluda como Rey de los Mártires, y que en su ministerio es sin duda primero entre todos los Profetas de Dios.

Dura Oposición para un Muchacho

Jeremías trata de rehuir su vocación. Dios le llama y él se siente pequeño, se achica ante un encargo que sabe difícil y que presiente que habrá de adueñarse de toda su vida y de todo en su vida. Su disculpa es sencilla: "¡Soy un muchacho!" Pienso que es la misma reacción que muchos jóvenes tendrían hoy, considerándose muy pequeños para servir en las filas del dios altísimo. lo curioso es que ya no sienten tan "pequeños" cuando se trata de aprender a fumar, emborracharse o disfrutar del sexo.

Dios no le recibió la disculpa a Jeremías (y probablemente tampoco se la recibiría a nuestros jóvenes hoy). Más bien, lo empujó a seguir su camino con fidelidad. Mas lo interesante es la manera de crear esa fidelidad. La base de la fidelidad es creer. Dios lo invita a creer en Aquel que lo envía, porque si Jeremías le cree a Dios será capaz de apostar hasta la propia vida por Dios.

¿Todavía Alguien le Cree a la Opinión Pública?

Una de las torturas de los profetas es la variabilidad de la opinión de la gente. Ya Luis de Granada decía que la opinión pública era como un monstruo de muchas cabezas o en todo caso monstruo. Y así es: la lectura del evangelio de hoy es, aun cuando no lo parece la estricta continuación de la lectura de la semana pasada, allí donde Jesús usa las palabras de Isaías para definir su misión en términos de liberar a los cautivos y sanar a los ciegos. Pues bien, hoy leemos cómo la gente le muestra primero admiración, luego extrañeza y luego aborrecimiento. Los mismos que le aplauden luego le insultan: así será la vida de Cristo, hasta el final: admirado y buscado, olvidado y desechado.

La gente trata así a los enviados de Dios porque trata así a Dios. Admiramos y buscamos a Dios, buscando en Él más bien sus favores; luego lo olvidamos y desechamos, apartándonos de sus mandatos. Queremos a un dios-marioneta, que haga lo que queremos y no pida nada. Un dios que esté a nuestro servicio y que sólo nos hable para decirnos: "Como tú digas." El Dios verdadero no es así. Para darnos bienes de su tamaño muchas veces tiene que negar los de nuestro tamaño.

AN ONGOING MISSION

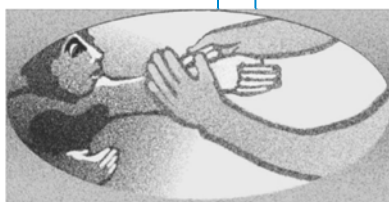
In his hometown synagogue, Jesus' neighbors are amazed by his words. Nevertheless, they remind each other, "Is this not Joseph's son?"

Surely the people know who he is. The carpenter's son. The young man who had learned in this very synagogue. The boy down the street.

Conflict arises as Jesus begins to define himself in a new way. When he compares himself to the ancient prophets Elijah and Elisha the tensions grow. The tensions multiply when Jesus begins to tell of a new mission for God's people: the good news of the scriptures is intended for all.

In his famous passage from the First Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul reminds us of the eternal nature of love. Love does not come to an end. In today's readings, we are reminded that, like love, Jesus' mission cannot be contained. Jesus slips through the crowd of persecutors and moves on to new challenges. We are called to this same perseverance in the name of love.

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UNA MISIÓN CONTINUA

Las tensiones se multiplican cuando Jesús empieza a hablar de una nueva misión para el pueblo de Dios: la Buena Nueva de la Escritura está dirigida a todos.

En su famoso pasaje de la primera carta a los Corintios, san Pablo nos recuerda la naturaleza del amor eterno. El amor no termina. En la lectura de hoy, se nos recuerda que, como el amor, la misión de Jesús no se puede detener. Jesús se desliza entre la multitud de perseguidores y sigue adelante con nuevos retos. Estamos llamados a esta misma perseverancia en nombre del amor.

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
