**LISTEN TO JESUS AND THE PROPHETS**

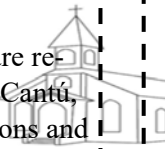

**Family Discussion:** Families strive for unity and togetherness. Nobody enjoys occasions when divisions in family life become all too evident. Yet, in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says that he has come to bring division and that members of households will be divided.

Talk as a family about the things that you do together to bring about family unity (togetherness), such as sharing meals, going to church together, celebrating special occasions, or sharing family traditions. Explain that all of these things are important and that Jesus wants families to show this kind of love for one another. Point out that this Sunday's Gospel sounds as though Jesus is saying something very different. Tell your children to listen closely as you read aloud Luke 12:49-53.

Explain that sometimes as parents, you have to make decisions that are unpopular with your children. You don't do it to divide the family but because it is the right thing to do. In the short run, such decisions may "divide" children from their parents. In the long run, however, doing the right thing will bring about a deeper unity. Talk to your children about decisions that they have to make that might be unpopular with their friends and how these decisions may divide them from others.

Encourage them to pray to the Holy Spirit for the gift of courage (fortitude) so that they may do the right thing even if unpopular. Conclude by praying a spontaneous prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking for the gift of courage (fortitude).

**From the desk of: Ms. Kathleen Cook, Director of Religious Education**



**Theme:** Choosing to follow Jesus.

**Summary:** In this gospel passage from Saint Luke we experience that being a disciplined follower of Jesus may indeed make us unpopular with others, and possibly with family or close friends. In remaining faithful to our discipleship we are also called to be loving towards those who may disagree with us. It is true that we are always to love the person even if their approach to life is different than ours. Division is a reality that we cannot escape, but we are called to love in the midst of it. Think of Jeremiah and Jesus and others who persevered in being different and unique and by doing so brought about very good things for their communities and us. One time Jesus said that he was going to be the cause of division among the people. He meant that even though he came to die on the cross to save the whole world, there would be some who would not believe. He wanted everyone to follow his teachings and be on his team, but he knew it wasn't going to be that way. There would be some who would follow, and others who would not.

Jesus, we love you and we want to follow you day by day. Help us to tell others that you love them too, and that you died for them, so that they might choose to follow you too. Amen.

**Making the Connection (Grades 1, 2, and 3):** Younger children are learning about right and wrong. Teach them that Jesus calls us to make good choices and do what is right even when it is difficult.

**Making the Connection (Grades 4, 5, and 6):** Children at this age are keenly aware of being included and excluded from peer groups. Use this Sunday's Gospel as an opportunity to talk about the challenge of doing the right thing even when it turns out to be the "road less traveled."

**Making the Connection (Grades 7 and 8):** Young people desperately seek peer approval. This Sunday's Gospel is challenging on many levels but is most helpful to this age group when approached within the context of understanding peer pressure.

**Scripture:** Jesus said to his disciples, "I have come to set the earth on fire. I know that some people will welcome my message of love, while others will reject it. Stand firm in the faith."

**Reflect:** If a word or phrase from the Gospel captures your heart, sit quietly for several minutes, repeating it to yourself and asking God to show you how it applies to your life. When have you seen Christian living spark conflict with friends or family?

## ANUNCIOS Y NOTICIAS ESPECIALES

### Vigésimo Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario

El común denominador de las lecturas de hoy es claro: el lenguaje de Dios no entra fácilmente en oídos humanos; por consiguiente, quien se ponga de parte de Dios encontrará oposición e incluso persecución. Jeremías tuvo en este sentido una misión difícil en extremo. La gente de su tiempo pretendía confiar en el templo de Dios, como señal de una alianza indeleble; al mismo tiempo, los actos de ellos contradecían espantosamente esa misma alianza. Correspondió a Jeremías denunciar esta incoherencia y mostrar también las consecuencias a las que habría de conducir, a saber, a la destrucción misma de Jerusalén y finalmente al destierro. La gente, en vez de buscar qué había de cierto en esas palabras, se lanzó en contra de quien las pronunciaba. Es importante notar el nexo que tiene el callar la voz de la conciencia y el silenciar a quienes quieren despertar en nosotros esa misma voz: los que se han acostumbrado a rechazar esa “voz de Dios” que es la propia conciencia sólo pueden rechazar esa otra “voz de Dios” que son sus profetas.

**No todo es malo en las divisiones** Es cierto que la unidad es un gran bien, pero no toda unidad está fundada en la verdad, y por lo tanto no toda unidad es verdadera. Lo grave de una unidad falsa es no sólo que no perdura, sino que al romperse deja heridas y prejuicios peores, porque añade a la desunión el hecho de la mentira. Esto quiere decir que hay también una paz falsa, y pretender esa paz es lo que se llama “irenismo.” La paz falsa es la que no quiere tocar los corazones ni las vidas sino que crea una apariencia de ausencia de conflicto. El irenismo consiste en buscar siempre negociaciones y compromisos, sin atreverse a buscar ni proponer la conversión. En el fondo es un modo de negar la potencia del amor transformante de Dios. Cristo en cambio nos quiere resueltos. No somos maquilladores de los problemas sino gente que cree que existen soluciones reales, aunque ellas pasan por la humillación del corazón, la admisión de nuestras responsabilidades y culpas, y sobre todo la acogida amorosa de la gracia que nos perdona y transforma. En este sentido hay que reconocer que somos distintos y que no podemos decir que sí a todo es un paso adelante, aunque por un tiempo produzca divisiones y conflictos. Bien sabemos que no es que nuestra sinceridad “produzca” el conflicto, sino que simplemente lo saca a luz, le impide esconderse. A la fase de denuncia tendrá que seguirle otra fase de conversión y de reconciliación, y a la fase de reconciliación otra etapa de construcción de una unidad sobre la verdad. Corona de todo ese esfuerzo será la paz, pero no una paz como la que da el mundo, sino sólo como aquella que el Señor mismo nos da a precio de su pascua.

### **Sankofa\* - Peregrinación que remarca el 400 aniversario de la llegada de africanos esclavizados**

\* Sankofa: "Debemos regresar al pasado para recuperar lo que se ha perdido para poder avanzar".

-Del pueblo Akan de Ghana

El 20 de agosto se cumple el 400 aniversario de la introducción de la trata de esclavos en las colonias inglesas americanas. En esa fecha en 1619, un barco esclavo portugués capturado, con destino a México, fue llevado a la colonia de la Royal Virginia Company en Jamestown y los primeros esclavos africanos fueron puestos a la venta. Jamestown fue un asentamiento anglicano (episcopal). Casi todas las denominaciones que llegaron a echar raíces en estas costas estarían implicadas en participar o tolerar la trata de esclavos hasta el surgimiento del movimiento abolicionista a fines de la década de 1700. Por lo tanto, la Iglesia tiene la responsabilidad de la institución de este horrendo evento. El impacto, la raíz del racismo que comenzó en esta fecha, sigue teniendo efectos asombrosos en nuestra nación, incluido lo que vemos en los medios de comunicación todos los días.

La Parroquia Episcopal de la Sagrada Familia se unirá a la parroquia católica romana de San Juan Vianney, la Iglesia Immanuel, las iglesias bautistas del sur y otras iglesias protestantes y las tradiciones de fe en una peregrinación que marca este evento crucial en la historia, el espíritu y la cultura de nuestra nación. ### **Sankofa\* - Pilgrimage Marking the 400th Anniversary of the Arrival of Enslaved Africans**

\*Sankofa – “We must reach back to reclaim that which is lost in order to move forward.”

-from the Akan people of Ghana

August 20 marks the 400th anniversary of the introduction of the slave trade into the English American colonies. On that date in 1619, a captured Portuguese slave ship, bound for Mexico, was brought to the Royal Virginia Company colony at Jamestown and the first African slaves were put up for sale. Jamestown was an Anglican (Episcopal) settlement. Almost every denomination which came to set roots on these shores would be implicated in participating or condoning the slave trade until the rise of the abolitionist movement at the end of the 1700s. Therefore, the Church carries responsibility for the institution of this horrendous event. The impact, the root of racism that began on this date, continues to have staggering effects on our nation, including what we see in the news media every day.

The Episcopal Parish of the Holy Family will join St John Vianney Roman Catholic parish, Immanuel Church, Southern Baptist and other Protestant churches and faith traditions in a pilgrimage marking this pivotal event in our nation's history, soul, and culture. It begins at 7:00 pm Holy Family, 5038 Hyland Ave at 7:00 pm with a Service of Repentance and Reflection and then will proceed to Immanuel, 467 N White Road.
