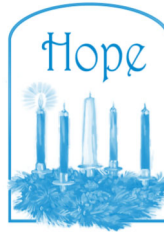


HOPEFUL EXPECTATION

Our liturgical year begins with the season of Advent—a time of hopeful expectation of the coming of the Lord. On the First Sunday of Advent we look forward to the end of time when we will awaken to the dawn of Christ's new day.

Today we hear Isaiah speak of a day when God's power will have brought universal peace and God's Word will have instructed all people, radiating God's "light" (teachings) into all of human society. Only when humanity walks "in the light of the LORD" (Isaiah 2:5), when all people desire to be instructed "in [God's] ways" (Isaiah 2:3), will the world be set aright and our deepest longings fulfilled. The reading from Romans calls us to "awake from sleep" for this final "day is at hand" (Romans 13:11, 12). Together this Sunday's scriptures proclaim our Christian faith that Jesus is the One who will finally come to fulfill God's plan of salvation.

Nuestro año litúrgico comienza con el tiempo de Adviento, una temporada de expectativa por la venida del Señor. En el Primer Domingo de Adviento anticipamos el fin de los tiempos cuando despertaremos al amanecer del nuevo día de Cristo.

Hoy escuchamos a Isaías hablar del día en que el poder de Dios habrá traído paz universal y la Palabra de Dios habrá instruido a todos los pueblos, irradiando la "luz" (enseñanzas) de Dios a toda la raza humana. Sólo cuando la humanidad camina "a la luz del Señor" (Isaías 2:5), cuando todos los pueblos deseen marchar "por sus sendas" (Isaías 2:3), el mundo se enderezará y nuestros más profundos anhelos serán cumplidos. La lectura de Romanos nos llama a despertar "del sueño" porque la salvación "está más cerca" (Romanos 13:11, 12). Las lecturas de este domingo proclaman nuestra fe cristiana en que Jesús es Aquél que al final vendrá a dar cumplimiento al plan de salvación de Dios.

Theme: Matthew 24:37-44 Jesus tells his disciples that the coming of the Son of Man will catch many people unprepared. Jesus tells his disciples that they are to always be ready for the day of the Lord.

Summary: Vigilance is the absolute theme of this passage from Matthew's gospel selected for this First Sunday of Advent. Jesus clearly indicates that calamity often occurs when one is not prepared or focused on that which is important. For the follower of Jesus it is essential to keep our eyes fixed on Him and on the Kingdom He preached. We are called to be prepared, that is **vigilant** and not passive in our waiting for the coming of the Lord. This Sunday and the Second Sunday of Advent place an emphasis on the second coming of the Lord, whereas the Third and Fourth Sundays will emphasize the coming of the Lord in history.

Scripture: "No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him." Matthew 24:36,44

Jesus told us that he would come again, but he didn't tell us what time he would be here. In fact, he said, "No one knows the day or hour when I will return. Only the Father knows. That is why you must be ready, I will come at a time when you least expect it." By doing the things that Jesus would want us to be doing -- loving one another, caring for the sick, feeding the hungry, and helping the poor. If we are doing those things, we will be ready when he comes.

Come to think of it, those are also the very same things that we should be doing to get ready for the celebration of Christmas! Instead of thinking about what we are going to get, we should be thinking about what we can give.

Dear Jesus, we look forward to the day when you return. Help us to live in such a way that we will be ready when you come. Amen.

First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5 When the prophet Isaiah speaks of the **mountain of the Lord's house**, he is referring to the temple of Jerusalem. In saying it is the highest of the mountains, Isaiah wants to communicate that there will come a time when the God of Israel will be known and revered by all the people of the world. Jacob was a grandson of Abraham and father of twelve sons, after whom the twelve tribes of Israel were named. **The house of Jacob** was another way to refer to all the people of Israel.

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14 The **works of darkness** are bad actions that break our friendship with God and other people. We prefer to keep them hidden or out of the light, because we're not proud of what we have done. The **armor of light** is our willingness and desire to follow the teachings of Jesus. To be friends of Jesus we must be ready to struggle against all that might distance us from God.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44 **Noah** was the just man chosen by God to be saved from the flood, along with his family and two of every animal. God asked Noah to build a huge boat, called an ark, in which he, his family and the animals lived during the flood. To **stay awake** is to avoid sleep throughout the night. However, it also means to be alert so that nothing can surprise us. Christians must live in such a way that we're ready at any moment to meet our Lord.

Reflect: If a word or phrase from the Gospel captures your heart, sit quietly for several minutes, repeating it to yourself and asking God to show you how it applies to your life. Where can you make a difference at home, at school, or in the world this Advent?

PRIMER DOMINGO DE ADVIENTO

Muchos siglos atrás un rabino preguntó a sus alumnos si sabían cuando terminaba la noche y comenzaba el día. Un alumno sugirió –"cuando ves un animal en la distancia y puedes decir si es una oveja o una cabra".

Otro dijo –"cuando ves un árbol en la distancia y puedes decir si es un manzano o una higuera". Cada uno de sus alumnos iba dando respuestas parecidas y ninguna parecía satisfacer al maestro.

Éste les dijo-"amanece de verdad cuando miras a la cara de cualquier ser humano y ves en esa cara el rostro de tu hermano o tu hermana, si no ves esto, sea la hora que sea, para ti es todavía de noche".

¿Qué visión alimenta nuestro caminar cristiano?

En este primer domingo de Adviento, nosotros dirigimos nuestra mirada al futuro. Jesús nos dejó, pero sabemos que volverá y nosotros esperamos su venida. Adviento es tiempo de espera. ¿Y por qué no nos dejó una tarjeta de visita con el día y la hora de la cita?

¿Por qué nos mantiene en este suspenso? "Vigilen porque no saben el día en que su Señor vendrá". A la hora que menos lo piensen vendrá el Hijo del Hombre. Hágase esta pregunta: ¿estas palabras de Jesús qué despiertan en su corazón? ¿Miedo o alegría?

Porque hay esperas y esperas. La espera del que no puede dormir porque el miedo le tortura y la espera del que no duerme por la ansiedad ante un encuentro largamente esperado.

¿Qué pretende Jesús con este silencio sobre la hora y el día de su segunda venida? ¿Meternos miedo o darnos una grata sorpresa? Todo depende de tu corazón miedoso o confiado. Todo depende de la experiencia y relación que has tenido con Él a lo largo de tu vida. Muchas veces te has podido encontrar con El.

Muchas veces se te ha revelado la belleza y el amor de Jesús. Muchas veces, en el pecado, en la frialdad y en el abandono has experimentado el perdón de Jesús. Jesús para nosotros no es nuevo, no es una sorpresa, no es una cita ciega. A lo largo de nuestra vida lo hemos ido conociendo y olvidando, amándolo unas veces y odiándolo otras. Una amistad con muchos altibajos.

A la hora que menos lo pienses y de la manera más imprevista, te encontrarás de nuevo con Él. ¿Cómo sería nuestra vida si creyéramos de verdad en la segunda venida del Señor?

Cada domingo, en el Credo, decimos: "Y de nuevo vendrá con gloria a juzgar"... Y en cada Misa decimos: "Ven, Señor, Jesús".
