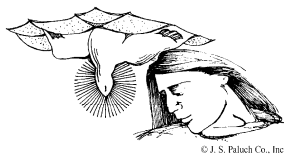

One way to express humility is by simply saying *thank you*. Thanking those around us is important, but it is also important to remember to thank God with a sincere heart. Today and every day, remember to thank God for all the blessings that you receive.

Family Discussion: At Jesus' baptism, God affirms his Son's mission for salvation. God announces his pleasure with Jesus and, in Matthew's Gospel, announces to all that, "This is my beloved Son" (Matthew 3:17). With this affirmation, Jesus is able to resist the temptations described next in Matthew's Gospel and to begin his public ministry. As family members, we can support one another in our Christian living by affirming the importance of each person in our eyes and in God's. Confident that through our Baptism we too were made children of God, we can resist temptation and share in Christ's mission.

Gather as a family to read today's Gospel, Matthew 3:13-17. Recall that God's message about Jesus was meant for us, "This is my beloved Son." It was also an affirmation for Jesus about his role in God's plan. Place each family member's name on a slip of paper and put the names in a bowl. Invite each person in the family to choose another family member's name and to prepare a message for that person, affirming their importance in God's eyes and in your family life. Pray together that your family will continue to support one another in your baptismal promises to be disciples of Jesus and then invite each person to read aloud the message they prepared. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer. www.loyolapress.com

Theme: Matthew 3:13-17 The Baptism of the Lord: The Spirit of God comes upon Jesus as John baptizes him.



Summary: In this very brief story, we are given a glimpse of the relationship between Jesus and Saint John the Baptist. Both individuals are true models of **humility**. Jesus **humbles** himself when he comes forward to be baptized as an example for others, while Saint John the Baptist states that his baptizing of others is merely a preamble to the great baptism that will come through Jesus. Neither men are driven by ego, but rather are led by the virtue of **humility**.

Scripture: *And behold, a voice out of the heavens, saying, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."* **Matthew 3:17**

Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan River where a man named John was preaching and telling people to confess their sins and be baptized. Jesus came to John and asked to be baptized. John was amazed that Jesus would ask to be baptized and tried to talk him out of it. "I am the one who needs to be baptized by you," he said, "so why are you coming to me?"

Jesus answered, "It must be done, for we must do all that God requires." So John agreed and baptized Jesus.

After his baptism, as Jesus came up out of the water, Scripture tells us that the heavens were opened and the Spirit of God descended from heaven like a dove and settled on him. Then came a voice from heaven saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist because it was important for him to do all that God had sent him to earth to do. Was God pleased with him? Yes he was and he said so. If Jesus thought it was important for him to follow the will of his Father, don't you think it is important for us to follow the example Jesus set for you and me to follow? Let's make that our goal as we begin the new year.

Heavenly Father, as we begin a new year, help us to follow the example Jesus set for us and live a life that is pleasing to you. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen. www.sermons4kids.com

First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7, **Isaiah** was a friend of God who lived about 800 years before Jesus. God chose him to help the people of Israel turn back to God.

A **servant** describes someone who does God's will. In the Book of Isaiah, the Lord's servant is a chosen one who suffers in order to bring forth justice. Christians believed this person is Jesus. God's servant will not rest until he **establishes justice**.

Second Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:34-38, **The Acts of the Apostles** is a book in the Bible that describes how the Church grew after Jesus rose from the dead. Written by Luke, who also wrote a gospel, it mostly tells the story of Peter and Paul. When **Peter** showed that he had a lot of faith in Jesus, Jesus chose him to be the leader of the apostles. In today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter speaks as the head of the new community. To show **partiality** is to be nice to one person and not another. God is impartial and treats everyone the same way----with love. The **baptism that John preached** called people to turn back to God. John the Baptist baptized people in the River Jordan to show that their sins were washed away. Today, the sacrament of Baptism unites us with Jesus and makes us part of the Church.

Gospel: Matthew 3:13-17

Reflect: If a word or phrase from the Gospel captures your heart, sit quietly for several minutes, repeating it to yourself and asking God to show you how it applies to your life. Who sees you as a Christian role model? How could you be an even stronger role model?

BAUTISMO DEL SEÑOR

Hoy, Fiesta del Bautismo de Jesús, clausuramos el tiempo de Navidad.

Navidad es tiempo de epifanías, tiempo de “SORPRESAS”, cuando abrimos los ojos de la fe y vemos sólo con el corazón.

El día de Navidad vimos en el niño recién nacido al niño Dios, el regalo de Dios para toda la vida. Fue nuestra primera epifanía.

El día de los Tres Reyes, en los magos simbólicos, vimos al niño Dios como Salvador del mundo y nos sentimos herederos de las promesas eternas. Fue nuestra segunda epifanía.

Hoy, en el Bautismo de Jesús en el río Jordán vemos a Jesús adulto, lanzado a su vida pública. Lavado y perfumado en el agua bautismal experimentamos la tercera epifanía, la epifanía total y trinitaria. Dios Padre habla y llama a Jesús su Hijo Amado y el Espíritu lo llena de su poder.

José y María se retiraron a Nazaret y allí, pasaron treinta años.

Un buen día Jesús, desde Galilea “se fue al Jordán y se presentó a Juan para que lo bautizara”. Hemos pasado del Niño Dios al Jesús adulto, comienza la Gran Historia.

Todos los principios son hermosos y casi siempre son gloriosos. Los principios, tanto en las aventuras humanas como en las religiosas, son fáciles, mantenerse fiel hasta el final de la aventura es lo difícil.

Jesús, en el día de su Bautismo comenzó a “cumplir todo lo que Dios quiere”. Sumergido en las aguas del río Jordán se revistió simbólicamente con todos los pecados del mundo. Jesús, el hombre sin pecado, también será expulsado de la ciudad para celebrar su bautismo de sangre y de perdón universal.

El día de su Bautismo es el día del comienzo de todo, de la búsqueda de los pecadores, de la sanación de los enfermos, del perdón de los pecados, de la nueva presencia de Dios en el mundo, presencia de la gracia y la verdad.

Jesús descubre su identidad y comienza su tarea que no consiste en hacer obras buenas y contar historias bonitas, como si fuera un trabajo de medio tiempo. La vocación de Jesús es una dedicación de tiempo completo a las cosas de su Padre, empujado siempre por la fuerza del Espíritu.

Todo comenzó el día de su Bautismo en las aguas del Río Jordán.

Todo terminó en la cruz con el Bautismo total en la Cruz. La última epifanía que tenemos que experimentar. Sin la Cruz no llegaremos a la Luz.

ESTE ES MI HIJO MUY AMADO

Con la celebración del Bautismo del Señor este domingo concluye el tiempo de Navidad. En las lecturas vemos más de una epifanía o manifestación del Espíritu de Dios en Jesús, sólo que esta vez ya no como niño, sino como adulto. El Bautismo de Jesús es también la inauguración de su misión profética y de la era mesiánica.

En la lectura de hoy Isaías describe al Mesías elegido por Dios sobre el cual ha puesto su Espíritu. En los Hechos de los Apóstoles Pedro dice que “Dios ungió con el poder del Espíritu Santo a Jesús de Nazaret” (Hechos 10:38). Finalmente, en la proclamación del Evangelio de Mateo el Bautismo de Jesús en el agua casi pasa desapercibido. El momento crucial ocurre cuando el Espíritu de Dios desciende sobre Jesús y una voz del cielo viene como un eco de las palabras de Isaías: “Este es mi Hijo muy amado, en quien tengo mis complacencias” (Mateo 3:17).

THIS IS MY BELOVED SON

This Sunday’s celebration of the Baptism of the Lord closes the Christmas season. In the scriptures we see one more epiphany, or manifestation, of the Spirit of God in Jesus—but this time it is as an adult, rather than as a child. Jesus’ baptism also serves as the inauguration of his prophetic mission and the messianic age.

Today’s reading from Isaiah describes God’s chosen Messiah, upon whom God’s spirit rests. In the Acts of the Apostles Peter says that “God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power” (Acts 10:38). Finally, in the proclamation from Matthew’s Gospel Jesus’ baptism in water goes almost unnoticed. The crucial moment comes when the Spirit of God comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven echoes the words of Isaiah: “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased” (Matthew 3:17).
