Pray that you will always keep in your mind and heart that God loves you and is always wanting to extend His love to you at every place and at every time in your life. Amen.

Family Discussion: When Jesus resists the temptations presented to him by the devil, he draws on his religious upbringing and tradition. Jesus is able to quote from Scripture because he is the Son of God and because he was a human person who lived his Jewish beliefs fully. We who are responsible for raising children are also called upon to immerse them fully in our Catholic Christian tradition so that they too will be able to draw upon this tradition to resist the temptations they will face in their lives.

Use this Sunday as an opportunity to call your family's attention to the importance of Scripture in our lives. Gather your family around the family Bible and read today's Gospel, Matthew 4:1-11. Recall that Jesus rebuked the devil's temptations by quoting Scripture. Take some time as a family to talk about the words that are found in the Bible and the importance of Scripture to our faith. Perhaps the older members of the family can share a favorite Scripture passage with everyone. Younger family members can tell their favorite story from the Bible and be shown where that story can be found. In each case, encourage a deeper sharing of faith by asking each person to tell why the Scripture passage shared is important to him or her. Conclude your time together by again reading Jesus' reply to the devil found in Matthew 4:4 ("One does not live by bread alone . . .") and praying the Lord's Prayer. www.loyolapress.com

You can help our children in English Faith Formation by sharing your faith, experiences and Good News as a catechist or aide. As you nurture their faith, you will learn and grow as well.

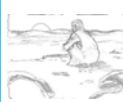
Beginning in September 2020-2021 Classes are on Sundays from 10:15-11:15 A.M at SJV School.

Theme: Matthew 4:1-11 Jesus fasts for 40 days in the desert and is tempted by the devil.

Summary: This section of Matthew's gospel recalls the temptation of Jesus in the desert. Through various symbols, such as bread, safety, and kingdoms, Jesus is presented with what have been and continue to be the temptations of human beings: pleasure, power and failure to accept responsibility. These particular things can displace the primary position of our relationship with God. Jesus consistently counters each of the devil's temptations with a reliance on the **Grace** of God. Throughout the scriptures we will see Jesus place ultimate trust in the Father's love (**Grace**) and providence.

Scripture: "Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'"

Jesus Is Tested in the Wilderness: Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. The tempter came to him and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread." Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'"

Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down. For it is written: " 'He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.' " Jesus answered him, "It is also written: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"

Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor.

"All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me." Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written:

'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.'"

Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him....
Dear God, help us do what Jesus did. Help us do what the Bible tells us to do instead of listening to what the devil wants us to do. In Jesus' name, amen. www.sermons4kids.com

First Reading: Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7. **Genesis** is the first book of the Bible. It tells many stories, including the stories of creation, Adam and Eve, the flood, Abraham, and the people's faith in God. These stories help us understand that God loves us and wants us to love him too. It is hard to understand fully the notions of **good and evil**. In this story from Genesis, we see evil as an enemy of God's, an enemy who tempts us to turn away from our Creator who is all-good.

Second Reading: 1 Romans 5:12-19. The **Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans** was written to the small community of Christians who lived in Rome. Saint Paul wanted to visit them, so he sent them this letter ahead of him, to encourage them and to remind them of the teachings of Jesus.

Gospel: Matthew 4:1-11. When we are **tempted**, we think about doing something we know to be wrong. The Spirit of God within us gives us the strength to say no to temptation. Every time we pray the Our Father, we ask God to give us this strength.

The **parapet** of the temple was its highest point. From here Jesus could see a great distance. It was also dangerously high.
When we **worship** God, we praise him for his love and mercy.

Lent is our time of preparation. A 40-day journey of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, Lent is a journey that spans Ash Wednesday through Holy Week, culminating in the great celebration of Easter. As Catholics, the spiritual pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving guide us in daily reflection on our own lives as we strive to deepen our relationship with God and neighbor—no matter where in the world that neighbor may live. Primer Domingo de Cuaresma Ciclo A

Vamos a Recuperar Nuestro Bautismo

Este año leemos en las misas del domingo textos del Evangelio según san Mateo. Este apóstol será entonces nuestro maestro particular durante el recorrido de la Cuaresma. Sin embargo, ya para el tercer domingo de este tiempo litúrgico intervendrá otro apóstol, Juan, que nos ofrecerá algunos pasajes de su Evangelio.

¿Cuál es el tema que da unidad a esta Cuaresma? Sabemos que la conversión la penitencia son parte esencial de la espiritualidad cuaresmal; sabemos también que el ayuno, la oración y la limosna son nuestras armas espirituales para este tiempo; sabemos, en fin, que, como todos los años, también ahora estamos avanzando hacia un punto focal: la pascua de Cristo. Pero ello no excluye preguntar cuál es la particularidad de esta Cuaresma en que Mateo y Juan nos van a enseñar tantas cosas. El énfasis de este año puede sintetizarse en la expresión: "un camino de luz;" o también diciendo: "vamos a recuperar nuestro bautismo." De lo que se va a tratar, en realidad, a lo largo de estas lecturas y en el conjunto de estos domingos, es de ese sacramento, el del bautismo, que en tiempos antiguos fue llamado precisamente "la iluminación." Se trata de un recorrido desde las tinieblas hacia la plenitud de claridad y gloria que vendrán con la Pascua del Señor Jesús.

Venciendo al Príncipe de las Tinieblas

Y como se trata de un camino que comienza en la oscuridad, las lecturas de este primer domingo nos presentan el poder del príncipe de las tinieblas. En la primera lectura, del Génesis, y en el texto del evangelio aparece expresamente la acción seductora y perturbadora del enemigo malo.

Con una diferencia radical: si en el texto del Génesis este enemigo logró lo que quería, es decir, engendrar desobediencia, sembrar orgullo y producir muerte, en el texto de san Mateo es él quien resulta vencido. Sus tentaciones fueron incapaces de confundir, doblegar o derrotar a Cristo. La enseñanza más obvia entonces es que admitimos que hay oscuridad y pecado; reconocemos que como seres humanos podemos caer y caemos, pero vemos también con alegría que hay uno que ha salido vencedor y en su victoria hay un germen de esperanza y también de victoria para nosotros.

Transmitiendo Vida

El apóstol san Pablo resume el estado de cosas en la segunda lectura de hoy: "así como por el pecado de un solo hombre, Adán, vino la condenación para todos, así por la justicia de un solo hombre, Jesucristo, ha venido para todos la justificación que da la vida. Y así como por la desobediencia de uno, todos fueron hechos pecadores, así como por la obediencia de uno, todos serán hecho justos."

El contraste es completo: desobediencia que produce condenación y luego muerte, por un lado; obediencia que trae justificación y luego vida, por el otro. Todos somos hijos de Adán, todos pertenecemos a la especie humana y participamos de la debilidad y estamos en el esquema de la rebeldía y la desobediencia. Pero hay un nuevo Adán que transmite vida, y quienes se unen a él participan de su fortaleza y entran en nuevo esquema de amistad y paz y salvo con Dios: esto es en últimas lo que quiere decir la palabra "justificación."

Así pues, apenas iniciada esta Cuaresma, alabemos a Dios por su victoria en la carne santísima de su Hijo Jesucristo, que padeció tentación sin pecar para que nosotros los pecadores pudiéramos vencer a la tentación y, unidos a él, recibir de su vida perdurable.
