Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last weekend, we informed you of how our Sunday Offertory had significantly decreased due the suspension of Masses, and begged you to consider signing up for on-line giving. Some of our parishioners graciously mentioned that they had already sent their donations by mail, or they would deposit them in our Parish Office mailbox. Thank you all for being so generous and making that happen. 25% of our giving parishioners moved to on-line giving.

The data indicates that not having Fiesta again this year, loss of event rental income, and a more modest rebate on ADA, would create a need for an additional \$2,000 per week from Sunday Offertory.

Our parish, as well as, parishes across the Diocese, and our Diocesan Offices are actively working on additional cost reduction measures to mitigate the impact.

Your response and support mean so much to our parish and community and it is an inspiration to other parishes. We encourage you to continue registering for online giving this week. We know that many of our parishioners have already been financially impacted, but they continue giving. Eventually they may not be able to. If you are in the position of increasing your donation by \$4 or \$5 weekly beginning next week, please be so kind to do so. If at least 500 of us agree, the financial damage created by the pandemic will be drastically reduced. Thank you very much for your generosity and sacrifice as we are blessing on one another !!

Queridas hermanas y hermanos:

El fin de semana pasado, le informamos de cómo nuestro ofertorio dominical había disminuido significativamente debido a la suspensión de las Misas, y le rogamos que considerara inscribirse en donaciones en línea. Algunos de nuestros feligreses amablemente mencionaron que ya habían enviado sus donaciones por correo, o que las depositarían en el buzón de la Oficina Parroquial. Gracias a todos por ser tan generosos y hacer que eso sucediera. El 25% de nuestros feligreses se inscribieron a donar en línea.

Los datos indican que no tener “Fiesta” nuevamente este año, la pérdida de ingresos por alquiler de eventos, y un reembolso más modesto en ADA, crearía la necesidad de \$2,000 adicionales proveniente de nuestras ofrendas dominicales

Nuestra parroquia, así como las parroquias en toda la Diócesis, y nuestras Oficinas Diocesanas están trabajando activamente en medidas de reducción de costos adicionales para mitigar el impacto.

Su respuesta y apoyo significan mucho para nuestra parroquia y comunidad y son una inspiración para otras parroquias. Le recomendamos que continúe registrándose para donaciones en línea esta semana. Pray that you will give thanks to God for striving to be faithful to the covenant of love made between you and God. Pray also that God will strengthen you to be one of the clearest images of God in the world.

Family Discussion: Jesus' promise of eternal life is a central element of our Catholic faith. Even though Easter is still two weeks away, our Gospel today invites us to acknowledge Jesus' power over death, evidenced in the raising of Lazarus, and to anticipate Jesus' conquering of death once and for all in his death and Resurrection. We sometimes use examples from nature to help describe this mystery of our faith. Jesus himself talked about the seed that dies when planted in the ground in order to produce new life (John 12:24). Using that image and others, we find hope and confidence in Jesus, the Resurrection and the life.

Gather your family today and read today's Gospel in its shorter form, John 11:3-7,17,20-27,33b-45. Write Jesus' promise from today's Gospel ("I am the resurrection and the life.") on a large sheet of white paper. As your family talks about what Jesus means by this promise, decorate Jesus' words with symbols that will remind you of his promise of eternal life. Display this reminder of Jesus' promise in a prominent place in your home and keep it there until Easter. Pray that you will always remain confident in Jesus' promise of eternal life. Conclude by praying together the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed..... www.lovofapress.com

Theme: John 11:1-45 Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead.



Summary: The action of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead is yet another sign of God's **covenant promise** of life. In all that Jesus does, we see the glory of God. In the raising of Lazarus, we have the most spectacular manifestation of God's glory through Jesus Christ. This sign or miracle is the backdrop for the religious authorities seeking to bring about the death of Jesus. This is the ultimate catalyst that begins the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus, which is the seal and fulfillment of the **covenant** God has made in His love for humanity. .

Scripture: *Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die."* **John 11:25-26**

There was a man named Lazarus who lived in Bethany with his two sisters, Mary and Martha. They knew Jesus and were his good friends. One day, Lazarus became sick. His sisters sent word to Jesus saying, "Lord, your dear friend Lazarus is very sick." But Jesus was in another town and didn't come right away.

When Jesus finally arrived in Bethany, Martha ran to meet Jesus and told him that Lazarus had been dead for four days. "If only you had been here, my brother would not have died." Jesus answered, "Your brother will rise again. I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever lives and believes in me will never die."

So Martha went back and got her sister Mary and they took Jesus to show him the place where Lazarus was buried. When he arrived at the tomb, Jesus told them to roll away the stone that covered the entrance. He prayed to his Father and then he called in a loud voice, "Lazarus come out!" Do you know what happened? Even though he had been dead for four days, Lazarus walked out of the tomb! He wasn't dead -- he wasn't even sick!

Jesus loves you just as he loved Lazarus and he wants to be your friend. He'll pick you up when you are down. He'll be with you to the bitter end.

Dear Jesus, you said, "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." Thank you for being our friend. Amen

First Reading: Ezekiel 37:12-14. **Ezekiel** was one of the most important prophets in Israel. He lived during a time when many of the people of Jerusalem were taken prisoner and forced to live in exile in Babylon. The king and Ezekiel were taken away, too. Ezekiel helped the people follow God's ways even though they were far from home.

The people of Israel lived in exile in Babylon and were very unhappy. Through the prophet Ezekiel, God promised to bring the people back to Israel. God said he would "**open your graves**" and bring new life to the dry, dead bones of the people of Israel.

In the Bible, God is called the **Lord** because God is more powerful than all human power.

Second Reading: Romans 8:8-11. The **Spirit of the One**, or the Holy Spirit, is the third person of the Holy Trinity. The Spirit of God is always present in our hearts and in the Church, helping us to live like brothers and sisters.

Gospel: John 11:1-5. The **Sisters of Lazarus** were Martha and Mary, and all three were Jesus' friends. They lived in Bethany, just a few miles from Jerusalem. When Jesus had visited them before, he had reminded the sisters that it was more important to listen to the word of God than to worry about daily chores.

When Jesus says that Lazarus **will rise** again, he is speaking of the resurrection of the dead when Jesus comes again at the end of time.

Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma

Cada día nos acercamos más a la fiesta central de todo el año: la Pascua, el misterio de la muerte y resurrección del Señor. Por nuestro bautismo, se nos concede la gracia de participar de ese misterio, pues el Espíritu Santo nos hace pasar de la muerte a la vida.

El bautismo, pues, es una muerte al pecado y una resurrección a la vida nueva en Cristo. La resurrección de Lázaro es una señal que anticipa lo que Jesús puede hacer en nosotros; por ello, la Iglesia nos ofrece en este domingo un pasaje del Evangelio que nos anima a ya no permanecer en la muerte del pecado, sino gozar de la vida en Cristo.

Dice el Evangelio que Lázaro salió del sepulcro “atados con vendas las manos y los pies”, y Jesús ordenó: “Desátenlo, para que pueda andar”. Hoy también muchas personas están atadas por la injusticia, por la explotación, por la falta de apoyos para salir de su miseria.

El analfabetismo no deja salir de la marginación a miles de personas, sobre todo mujeres. La peor atadura es el pecado. Como la envidia, la soberbia, la mentira, la corrupción, el desenfreno sexual, la pereza, la gula. Muchos se sienten atados por el alcoholismo, la drogadicción, la homosexualidad, aunque no faltan quienes presuman de ellos. Como el difunto Lázaro, huelen mal.

La afirmación más clara de Jesús en este Evangelio es: “Yo soy la resurrección y la vida. El que cree en mí, aunque haya muerto, vivirá; y todo aquel que está vivo y cree en mí, no morirá para siempre”. En efecto, desde nuestro bautismo, Jesucristo nos ha liberado de la esclavitud del pecado y nos ha compartido su propia vida. Acerquémonos a Jesucristo, y seremos libres. Creamos firmemente en El, y veremos cómo cambia nuestra vida. Dejémonos tocar por El, y romperemos nuestras esclavitudes.

Oración por una Pandemia

Que nosotros, que solo estamos algo incómodos, recordemos a aquellos cuyas vidas están en juego.
Que los que no tenemos factores de riesgo recordemos a los más vulnerables.
Que los que tenemos el lujo de trabajar desde casa recordemos a aquellos que deben elegir entre preservar su salud o pagar la renta.
Que quienes tenemos la flexibilidad de cuidar a nuestros hijos cuando cierran sus escuelas recordemos a aquellos que no tienen opciones.
Que los que tenemos que cancelar nuestros viajes recordemos aquellos que no tienen un lugar seguro para ir.
Que nosotros que estamos perdiendo nuestro margen de dinero en el tumulto del mercado económico recordemos aquellos que no tienen margen en absoluto.
Que los que estamos en cuarentena en casa recordemos a los que no tienen hogar.
Mientras el miedo se apodera de nuestro país, elijamos el amor.
Durante este tiempo cuando no podemos entrelazar nuestros brazos físicamente, encontremos formas de ser el abrazo amoroso de Dios hacia nuestros vecinos.

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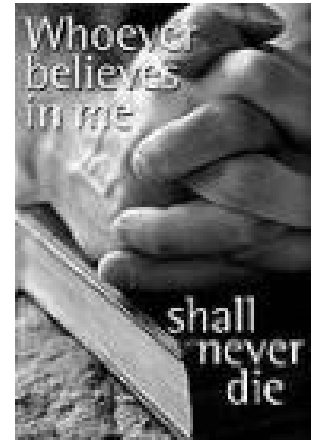

On the Fifth Sunday of Lent, just before we begin to enter Holy Week, we are summoned to Bethany. If we had been friends of Mary, Lazarus, and Martha, and found out that Lazarus was gravely ill, we probably would have dropped everything to be with them. This was what was so surprising about the behavior of Jesus. Although he was their close friend, he chose to stay away, that God’s glory would be manifested. This is a persistent theme in John’s Gospel. Right to the very end, Jesus’ works were meant to give glory to the Father. As our Lenten journey reaches a crescendo, let us be mindful that, as people who have “put on Christ” in baptism, we are also called, by our attitudes and actions, to give glory to God.
