**Dear Sisters and Brothers of  
 Saint John Vianney Community**

As we hear in the Easter Good News:  
**Then the angel said to the women in reply,  
 "Do not be afraid!"**

Words all of us yearn to hear and believe during these seemingly dark and challenging days. What fearsome verses Matthew gives us in this reading, and what loving compassion shines through that fear as God's messenger, the angel, and the risen Christ quickly reassure the women.

The sights and the sounds that greeted the women as they arrived at the tomb were so terrifying that the guards were immobilized, like many of us seem to be. But not the women, women who would have been defenseless against any physical threat. Instead, the angel acknowledged their fear before explaining his mission. He did not brush away or ignore their very human reaction to a frightening series of events; he knew they would be frightened, and he knew that their emotions needed to be calmed before their faith could emerge to guide their actions. Likewise, we need to admit and confront our fears and conflicting emotions at this time. Our emotions are God-given. Without some of the fear the women felt, we cannot fully share in their joy. Without the fear, the joy would have been less sweet upon meeting Christ.

No matter how emotionally fraught we might be, the Easter Good News is: Christ's compassion is boundless, and will lead us all beyond this to New Life Beginning here and now.

Del mismo modo, debemos admitir y confrontar nuestros miedos y emociones conflictivas en estos momentos. Nuestras emociones son dadas por Dios. Sin sentir un poco del miedo que sintieron aquellas mujeres, no podríamos compartir plenamente su alegría. Sin el miedo, la alegría habría sido menos dulce al encontrarse con Cristo.

No importa cuán emocionalmente afectados estemos, la Buena Nueva de Pascua es: La compasión de Cristo no tiene límites, y nos llevará a todos más allá de esto, a una nueva vida que comienza aquí y ahora.

**Saint John Vianney Parish is working with the City of San Jose, Catholic Charities and Second Harvest for some disaster relief.** At this point, we are providing food only.

Second Harvest will be manning the food distribution behind the St John Vianney Community Center, 4602 Hyland Ave, San Jose 95127 every Thursday morning (9AM-11AM) for the foreseeable future. This will be drive through style. Someone will register you via verbal questions at the CDC-prescribed distance from your car. You will need to tell them your name, DOB, number in your household and ages, your phone number and if this is your first time using Second Harvest. They will give you a card which you are to bring in the future when you go to Second Harvest for food. Then you pop your trunk and they will put boxes of food in the car. (Empty your trunk before going so you have room.)

St. Vincent de Paul will still do food distributions on Monday from 3PM-4PM. For this, you need to call 408 535-0404 and let us know that you're coming for food. We are currently not offering vouchers.

Hasta ahora, estamos proporcionando sólo alimentos.

Second Harvest (Segunda Cosecha), se encargará de la distribución de alimentos detrás del Centro Comunitario de San Juan Vianney, 4602 Hyland Ave, San José 95127 todos los jueves por la mañana (9AM-11AM) para el futuro previsible. Esto será desde su carro. Alguien lo registrará a través de preguntas verbales a distancia prescrita por el CDC (no tiene que dejar su carro). Usted tendrá que decirles su nombre, fecha de nacimiento, número de personas en su hogar y sus edades, su número de teléfono y si esta es su primera vez usando Second Harvest. Ellos le darán una tarjeta que usted debe traer en el futuro cuando vaya por comida. Luego abra su cajuela y le pondrán las cajas de comida en el carro. (Vacíe su cajuela antes de ir, para que tenga espacio.)

San Vicente de Paul todavía hará distribuciones de alimentos el lunes de 3PM-4PM. Para esto, usted necesita llamar al 1 (408) 535-0404 y hacernos saber que usted va a venir por comida. Actualmente no ofrecemos cupones.

**Family Discussion:** In the Easter Gospel we hear about how the disciples found the tomb empty three days after Jesus' death. We are also told that they do not yet understand the Scriptures or that Jesus had been raised from the dead. That understanding gradually unfolded for the disciples as they began to experience the risen Lord. Similarly, our understanding of Jesus' Resurrection unfolds for us throughout our lives. In the weeks ahead, we will hear how the first disciples moved from confusion, doubt, and skepticism to faith. Their experience can teach us how we too might receive this gift of faith from God.

Gather your family members and ask them to share what they know about the events that happened in the days after Jesus' crucifixion. Invite your family to imagine that they are among Jesus' first disciples. Read together today's Gospel, John 20:1-9.

Reflect together on the Gospel with questions such as these: If you had been among the first disciples who heard that the stone had been removed from Jesus' tomb and that Jesus' body was no longer there, what would you think? What did Mary of Magdala, Simon Peter, and the disciple whom Jesus loved think had happened? Recall that this experience is the first indication Jesus' disciples have that he is risen. Throughout the Easter season, we will learn more about how the disciples came to believe that Jesus had been raised from the dead. Pray together using today's psalm, Psalm 118: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad." ..... [www.lovolapress.com](http://www.lovolapress.com)

**Theme: John 20:1-9** Mary of Magdala finds that the stone has been removed from Jesus' tomb.

**The Story of EASTER** <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bv5ajWNrnt4>

**Summary:** In this account of the resurrection we experience only the *empty tomb*, no angelic proclamation, no encounter with the risen Lord speaking to Mary of Magdala—just an *empty tomb*. The empty tomb became the earliest symbol of the resurrection in the fledgling church. Mary, out of her confusion, runs to the disciples to share that the stone was rolled away and that tomb was empty. Peter and John rush to the sight and John, upon seeing the burial garments neatly wrapped, is **confident** that Jesus was indeed risen from the dead. John saw and believed even in the midst of *not understanding* completely. **Hope** then, is an essential part of the process of coming to faith. Indeed these three virtues; faith, **hope**, and love are absolutely intertwined.

**Scripture: Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that he had said these things to her. John 20:18**

Early on Sunday morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb where Jesus had been buried. She found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. She ran and found Simon Peter and another disciple, whose name was John. She told them, "They have taken the Lord's body out of the tomb, and I don't know where they have put him!"

Peter and John started out for the tomb. They were both running, but John outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He stooped and looked in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he didn't go in. Then Simon Peter arrived and went inside. He also noticed the linen wrappings, while the cloth that had covered Jesus' head was folded up and lying apart from the other wrappings. Then the disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in, and he saw and believed -- for until then they still hadn't understood the Scriptures that said Jesus must rise from the dead. Then they went home.

Mary stayed behind and stood outside the tomb weeping. As she knelt down and looked inside, she saw two angels dressed in white. They asked her why she was crying. She told them that someone had taken her master and she didn't know where they had taken him. Then, Mary turned and saw a man standing behind her. It was Jesus, but Mary did not recognize Him. She thought he was the gardener. Then Jesus called her by name and, when she heard his voice, she recognized Him. After she saw that it was Jesus, she went to the disciples and said to them, "I've just seen Jesus! He is alive!"

Some people, like Mary, Peter, and John can't see Jesus because they are looking for Him in a grave or on a cross. He isn't there! He is risen and is seated at the right hand of His Father in heaven. If you want to see Jesus, look in His Word, He will reveal Himself to you, just as He did to Mary!

Dear God, we thank you that Jesus, our Savior, is not in a grave. He is alive! We serve a risen Savior! Hallelujah! Amen... [www.sermons4kids.com](http://www.sermons4kids.com)

**First Reading:** Acts of the Apostles 10:34,37-43. The **Acts of the Apostles** is a book in the New Testament that describes how the Church grew after Jesus rose from the dead. It was written by Saint Luke, who also wrote a gospel.

To **anoint** means to bless with oil. In the Bible it can also mean to give someone a mission, an important job. God anoints Jesus with the Holy Spirit to show that God was giving Jesus his mission. Christians are anointed at baptism and confirmation, we anoint people when they are very sick, and priests and bishops are anointed at their ordination: our mission is to live as Jesus taught us.

**This man God raised:** Jesus' resurrection, his passing through death to eternal life, is the most important element of the Christian faith. We believe that Jesus did not remain dead in the tomb, but overcame death, suffering, and sin. We want to live as he taught, in order to be united with him now and in the next life.

The **prophets** were good men and women who spoke for God. Sometimes their message was harsh: they asked people to make big changes in their lives and attitudes in order to grow closer to God. At other times, they brought words of comfort.

**Second Reading:** Colossians 3:1-4. Saint Paul wrote to the **Colossians**, a Christian community at Colossae in modern-day Turkey to help them to understand that Jesus Christ is above everything. No powers are greater than Jesus' power.

**What is above**, that is, the things in heaven, are those that Jesus teaches; finding the truth, living simply, trusting in God, and caring for those in need. The things of earth distract us from Jesus: being selfish, hurting others, and ignoring the poor.

**Gospel:** John 20:1-9. The **burial cloths** were the fabric that covered the body of a dead person in the tomb. Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus made sure that Jesus' body was treated with dignity and buried properly: they covered his face and then wrapped his body with burial cloths.

Hoy, me toca a mí anunciarlo, hermanos y hermanas, pero no soy el primero y no seré el último en ser testigo y dar testimonio de este gran milagro.

¿Creen ustedes en este anuncio de la iglesia?

Durante más de dos mil años, desde los apóstoles, éste ha sido el primer credo de los creyentes: Cristo es Señor. Cristo es Salvador. Y es Señor y Salvador a causa de la resurrección. El amor de Dios es más fuerte que la muerte. Sólo el amor tiene la última palabra. Sólo el amor puede derrotar la muerte. Pascua es el triunfo del amor. Pascua es tiempo de alegría y esperanza. Pascua proclama que Dios existe y que está del lado de la vida y la bondad. Al devolver a Jesús a la vida, Dios revela su activa preocupación por nosotros y su compromiso con nuestra historia.
