Pray that you will always be a source of blessing to each and every community of which you belong and that those in community with you will also be a source of blessing. Amen

Family Discussion: Many of us can relate to Thomas's response to the news that the disciples had seen Jesus. We want to see for ourselves too, but we grow in faith, trusting the experience and knowledge of others. Many of us have heard the saying "Seeing is believing." As your family gathers, take some time to consider what that saying means. What are some things we believe because we see them? Is there anything we believe without seeing? Today's Gospel reminds us that faith sometimes asks us to believe things we cannot see with our eyes. Read today's Gospel, John 19:19-31, with your family. Think about Thomas's response to the reports about the risen Lord. Is Thomas's doubt reasonable? How does Jesus respond to Thomas? Jesus grants Thomas the evidence that Thomas needs to believe, but Jesus also affirms the faith of those who will be called upon to believe without first-hand experience. We are among those whom Jesus calls blessed. Discuss with your family the basis of each member's faith in Jesus—the witness of the first disciples, the Gospels, the continuing activity of the Holy Spirit, the community of the Church.

From the desk of: Ms. Kathleen Cook, Director of Religious Education

Theme: John 20:19-31 Sunday of Divine Mercy. Thomas believes because he sees Jesus. .

Summary: The encounter we have with St. Thomas in today's gospel actually brings all of us hope. Thomas represents all of us in our struggle with faith. We all are a combination of both believing and disbelieving. A **community** of believers is essential for us when in the throws of doubt. Notice that the name Thomas means "twin." We never learn whom he is twin to and thus scripture scholars believe that it is a literary device to allow us to be the twin. We too, like Thomas, have our moments of doubt and likewise our moments where we proclaim in full faith that Jesus is *my Lord and my God*. It is important to recognize that when Jesus bestows the Holy Spirit upon the disciples, he does so when they are gathered as a **community**. Jesus bestows upon them the power to bind and loose sins as a community. To this day when a priest gives absolution for sins, it is in the name of Jesus Christ and through the ministry of the Church (**Community**).

Scripture: Now Thomas (called Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" John 20:24-25

One of the disciples, whose name was Thomas, was not there with the others in that room when Jesus appeared to them. The next time the other disciples saw Thomas, they told him what he had missed when he was absent. They said, "We have seen Jesus. He is alive!" Thomas didn't believe them. He said, "**Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe it,**"

The next week the disciples were in the house again, and this time Thomas was with them. The very same thing happened again. Even though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among his disciples. **He turned to Thomas and said, "See my hands; put your fingers here. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."**

Thomas didn't need to touch the wounds where the nails had been or put his hand into his side. He fell on his knees before Jesus and said, "My Lord and my God!"

One of the great promises Jesus made was when he said, "Where two or three gather in my name, I am there with them." Each week we come together in the name of Jesus to worship and to praise him. So, what do we miss out on if we are absent? We miss out on the same thing that Thomas missed out on when he was absent -- the chance to be with Jesus!

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47. The apostles gathered for the **breaking of bread**, which means they celebrated the Lord's Supper, as we do at every Eucharist or Mass.

In the early Christian community, those who believed in Jesus shared all their belongings **in common**. This way, everyone had all they needed. Today, we can do the same by making sure that no one in our community is in need.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9. The **First Letter of Saint Peter** is found in the New Testament. It is a summary of the good news of Jesus and was written to help the early Christians lead faithful lives.

We **rejoice** in our salvation, even when life seems difficult. Jesus conquered death by rising from the dead and we know we will see him when he comes again.

Gospel: John 20:19-31. The **Gospel of John** tells us about the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. It was written about 60 years after Jesus died. Saint John's gospel includes some stories and sayings that are not in the other three gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke).

By showing **his hands and his side**, Jesus presents the scars left by the nails and the lance that pierced him. It is a way of saying, "It's really me. I was dead, but now I am alive."

When God created the first humans, he **breathed** life into them. Our life comes from the depths of God's being. When Jesus appeared to his disciples after his death, he also breathed on them, filling them with his Spirit.

ANUNCIOS Y NOTICIAS ESPECIALES

Segundo Domingo de Pascua – La Divina Misericordia

Sangre y Agua

"Dad gracias al Señor porque es bueno, porque es eterna su misericordia" (Sal 118, 1). Así canta la Iglesia en la octava de Pascua, casi recogiendo de labios de Cristo estas palabras del Salmo; de labios de Cristo resucitado, que en el Cenáculo da el gran anuncio de la misericordia divina y confía su ministerio a los Apóstoles: "Paz a vosotros. Como el Padre me ha enviado, así también los envío yo. (...)

Reciban el Espíritu Santo; a quienes les perdonen los pecados les quedan perdonados; a quienes se los retengan les quedan retenidos" (Jn 20, 21-23).

Antes de pronunciar estas palabras, Jesús muestra sus manos y su costado, es decir, señala las heridas de la Pasión, sobre todo la herida de su corazón, fuente de la que brota la gran ola de misericordia que se derrama sobre la humanidad. De ese corazón Santa Faustina Kowalska, verá salir dos haces de luz que iluminan el mundo: "Estos dos haces -le explicó un día Jesús mismo- representan la sangre y el agua" (Diario, Librería Editrice Vaticana, p. 132).

¡Sangre y agua! Nuestro pensamiento va al testimonio del evangelista san Juan, quien, cuando un soldado traspasó con su lanza el costado de Cristo en el Calvario, vio salir "sangre y agua" (Jn 19, 34). Y si la sangre evoca el sacrificio de la cruz y el don eucarístico, el agua, en la simbología de San Juan, no sólo recuerda el bautismo, sino también el don del Espíritu Santo (cf. Jn 3, 5; 4, 14; 7, 37-39).

La misericordia divina llega a los hombres a través del corazón de Cristo crucificado: "Hija mía, di que soy el Amor y la Misericordia en persona", pedirá Jesús a sor Faustina (Diario, p. 374). Cristo derrama esta misericordia sobre la humanidad mediante el envío del Espíritu que, en la Trinidad, es la Persona-Amor.

Y ¿acaso no es la misericordia un "segundo nombre" del amor (cf. Dives in misericordia, 7), entendido en su aspecto más profundo y tierno, en su actitud de aliviar cualquier necesidad, sobre todo en su inmensa capacidad de perdón?

Hoy es verdaderamente grande mi alegría al proponer a toda la Iglesia, como don de Dios a nuestro tiempo, la vida y el testimonio de sor Faustina Kowalska. La divina Providencia unió completamente la vida de esta humilde hija de Polonia a la historia del siglo XX, el siglo que acaba de terminar. En efecto, entre la primera y la segunda guerra mundial, Cristo le confió su mensaje de misericordia. Quienes recuerdan, quienes fueron testigos y participaron en los hechos de aquellos años y en los horribles sufrimientos que produjeron a millones de hombres, saben bien cuán necesario era el mensaje de la misericordia. Jesús dijo a sor Faustina: "La humanidad no encontrará paz hasta que no se dirija con confianza a la misericordia divina" (Diario, p. 132). A través de la obra de la religiosa polaca, este mensaje se ha vinculado para siempre al siglo XX, último del segundo milenio y puente hacia el tercero. No es un mensaje nuevo, pero se puede considerar un don de iluminación especial, que nos ayuda a revivir más intensamente el evangelio de la Pascua, para ofrecerlo como un rayo de luz a los hombres y mujeres de nuestro tiempo.
