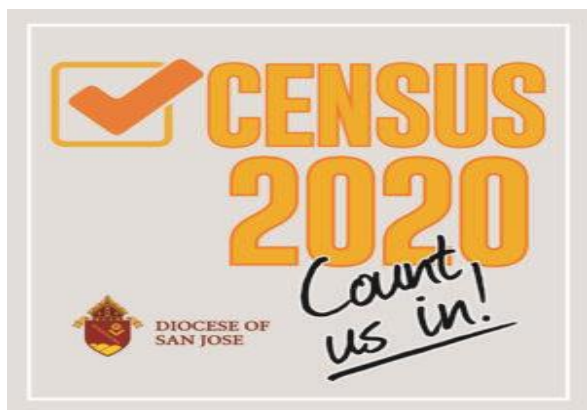

**Family Discussion:** Families, as the domestic church, have the opportunity to make the family meal a time of prayerful encounter with one another and with Jesus. At a family meal we share our experiences of the day and connect them with the experiences of others in the family. We can also enjoy the meal as an opportunity to reflect upon our family life in light of Scripture. At their best our family meals can connect us to Jesus too.

Choose a family meal this week to share one another's experiences of the week in a special way. Perhaps invite family members to plan and prepare the meal together. Begin the meal by reading today's Gospel, Luke 24:13-35. As you eat, talk together about how the disciples discussed their experiences in Jerusalem and how they came to understand them differently when Jesus interpreted those events in the light of Scripture. Then invite each family member to share the things that are going on in his or her life. Consider what Jesus might say to each person if he were sitting at your dinner table. Conclude with a special prayer after your dinner. Pray a prayer of blessing for each family member, asking that Jesus continue to be present in each person's life, helping each one to be a better follower of Jesus. Conclude with a Sign of Peace..... **Theme: Luke 24:13-35** Jesus appears to two disciples who are walking to Emmaus. [49 Luke 24 Road to Emmaus #143F](#)

**Summary:** Here we encounter the despondent moods of two disciples who are traveling to Emmaus. It is only in their listening to Jesus, disguised as a stranger, who they meet along the way that they begin to have their spirits lifted. They share their dashed hopes and then Jesus, beginning with Moses, shares with them all that has to do with the Messiah. It is only when they sit to eat and see Jesus in the breaking of the bread that they come to the realization that their hopes have been fulfilled. It was because of their attentive listening that they truly heard and realized that their hearts were on fire as he talked with them along the way. We are also called to a deep listening that moves from merely hearing with our ears to listening with our entire being.

**Scripture:** As they sat down to eat, he took the bread and blessed it. Then he broke it and gave it to them. Suddenly, their eyes were opened, and they recognized him. And at that moment he disappeared!

After Jesus was crucified and had risen from the dead, his followers were very sad and confused. They didn't know what was going to happen next. One day two of Jesus' followers were walking to the village of Emmaus. As they walked along, Jesus came and began walking with them, but God kept them from recognizing him.

As they walked, they discussed all of the things that had happened. As they came near to Emmaus, it was late in the day so they asked the stranger who had been walking with them to stay the night with them. So Jesus went to their home. As they sat down to eat, Jesus took the bread and blessed it and gave it to them to eat. Suddenly, their eyes were opened and they recognized him. At that very moment, he disappeared!

The two followers went back to Jerusalem and found the eleven disciples and others who had gathered with them. They told them the story about how Jesus had appeared to them as they traveled to Emmaus and how they had recognized him as he was breaking bread. Just as they were telling them about it, Jesus himself appeared and stood among them. The whole group was frightened, thinking they were seeing a ghost! "Why are you frightened?" Jesus asked. "Look at my hands and feet. You can see that it is really me. Touch me and be assured that I am not a ghost."

Jesus still reveals himself to his followers today, but he does it through his Word and the Holy Spirit. He may not appear to you in the same way he did to the disciples in our Scripture today, but if you study God's Word and seek him with all your heart, Jesus will reveal himself to you.

Our Father, help us to study your Word and to apply it in our daily life. Open our eyes, Lord, we want to see Jesus. In the name of Jesus we pray. Amen.

**First Reading:** Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 22-33. David was the second king of Israel. He lived about 1,000 years before Christ. David is considered to be the author of the 150 psalms. In this passage from the Acts of the Apostles, Saint Peter is quoting from Psalm 16.

**Second Reading:** 1 Peter 1:17-21. If we have reverence for someone, we are filled with awe because of their greatness and we try to honor them with our lives.

Jewish people made sacrifices of animals to God. Because Jesus' sacrifice brought us back to God, the Bible compares Jesus to a lamb, one without any stain.

**Gospel:** Luke 24:13-35. The Gospel of Luke is one of the four gospels in the New Testament or Christian Scriptures. It was written for people who, like Saint Luke, weren't Jewish before becoming Christian.

The Scriptures are the written word of God. We read them in the Bible, both the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and the Christian Scriptures (New Testament).

Jesus' disciples recognized him in the breaking of the bread, because Jesus had done the same thing at many meals, especially the Last Supper. Jesus said to do this in his memory, and we remember Jesus as our living bread when we celebrate the Eucharist.

## ANUNCIOS Y NOTICIAS ESPECIALES

### TERCER DOMINGO DE PASCUA

El Evangelio nos cuenta la linda historia de los dos discípulos en el camino a Emaús. Nos hace preguntarnos como fuera posible que estos dos discípulos que sabían tanto de Jesús y de sus enseñanzas hayan podido caminar once kilómetros en su presencia sin reconocerle. Le llamaron forastero, persona de lejos, individuo desconocido. Nos imaginamos que habían visto a Jesús en varias ocasiones, tal vez habían hablado con Él, y habían escuchado sus palabras. Sin embargo, es solamente en la fracción del pan alrededor de la mesa que se les abrieron los ojos.

Es interesante que le reconocieran en la fracción del pan. Probablemente estos dos no estaban presentes la noche de la Última Cena. Ellos no habían escuchado las palabras de Jesús diciendo que el pan era su Cuerpo. La cena que ellos dos compartieron con Jesús era una cena ordinaria de dos viajeros llegando a su destino, cansados, desilusionados, y sin esperanza. Ellos habían escuchado las palabras de Jesús explicando los pasajes de las Escrituras que se referían a él. Ellos mismos decían que su corazón ardía al escucharle. Pero el poder de Dios viene en el momento de la fracción de pan, y se abrió su mente para entender.

Igual como con los otros discípulos que no reconocieron a Jesús después de la Resurrección, no era un caso de su memoria fallando. Era que el reconocimiento a Jesús dependía en la acción del Espíritu Santo. María Magdalena escuchó la voz de Jesús diciendo su nombre con amor, y le reconoció. Los discípulos escucharon su voz ofreciéndoles paz, y le reconocieron. En el evangelio de la semana pasada, sabemos que mismo después de la primera aparición a los discípulos en el cuarto cerrando, ellos quedaron encerrados en el cuarto. Es solamente cuando el Espíritu Santo les dan el impulso que salen para predicar, como Pedro en la primera lectura hoy.

Estas lecturas nos hacen pensar. Es muy posible que nosotros no reconocemos a Cristo cuando Él está con nosotros en los acontecimientos de la vida. Como los discípulos, tenemos en la mente una expectativa de cómo va a parecer Jesús, como le vamos a ver, y bajo qué circunstancias Él va a estar presente. Pero Jesús no está limitado por nuestro entendimiento, por nuestras ideas y nuestros modos de pensar. Es muy posible que Jesús está caminando con nosotros y tenemos los ojos cerrados, como los discípulos en el camino de Emaús.

Son muchas las ocasiones cuando caminamos con duda, con preocupación, con miedo, especialmente ahora en momento de crisis. Son muchas las ocasiones cuando caminamos sin alegría, sin confianza, sin esperanza. A veces platicamos con unos amigos, compartiendo nuestra tristeza y preguntándonos como Dios puede dejarnos así. Son muchas las ocasiones cuando pensamos que todo lo que hemos hecho hasta ahora está en vano. Y de repente, con una palabra, un gesto, o una mirada, se abren nuestros ojos y nos demos cuenta de que Jesús está presente.

En las lecturas vemos que una vez que los discípulos reconocen a Jesús, se convierten en mensajeros de la Buena Nueva. Dentro de poco vamos a recibirle a Jesús bajo la apariencia de Pan y Vino en la Santa Comunión o pueda ser en Comunión Espiritual. Vamos a pedir al Espíritu Santo que nos llene con su poder para ver, para creer, y para convertirnos en mensajeros de la Buena Nueva. Así, nuestras palabras, nuestras acciones y nuestro amor proclamarán que Jesús resucitó. Jesús vive y está con nosotros.

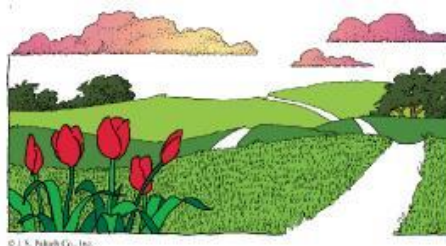
