**What discourages you in life**, from doing your best for your family, Church and community? Most probably, it is misunderstanding, disagreements, lack of appreciation arising from giving yourself in the service of good. Many give up because of undeserved negative experiences poured on them. Often, the immediate reaction is to resign, cease doing the good and decidedly hang our gloves!

Well, this weekend, we are invited to learn from St. Paul on what it takes to persevere doing good despite disappointments. St. Paul will be the first to endorse the statement: "Perseverance overcomes everything." It is loaded with practical wisdom. Writing to young Bishop Timothy, he advised him: "If we persevere we shall also reign with him" (2Timothy 2:12).

What is the secret of Paul's fighting spirit; his "never say die" attitude? What gave him the passion, energy and fortitude even in the face of persecution, betrayal and gross disappointments, not to allow the Good News to be chained or silenced? St. Paul had a missionary faith and vocation. He relied on God, not himself, in the proclamation of the Gospel. With the Lord, he knew he could do all things in him. So even though he was in prison and eventually martyred, Paul never thought his mission was a failure. He trusted in the Lord to act for him in his powerlessness as he faced imminent execution.

Indeed, in all that we do, we must never think it is our work but the work of God in and through us. With such a faith, we too can overcome all trials and challenges because with the Lord in and with us, we will always be victorious.

If for some reason or other you are going through the blues, please, pick yourself up, shift your attention to the needs of others, and place your trust in God. Ask God to inflame you with a greater desire to do his will, day by day. Bit by bit, the river grows!

**In the Creed, we profess belief in the "Communion of Saints."** One significant and expedient aspect of this belief is the affirmation that there exists a spiritual bond, a communion of life and solidarity between all who belong to Christ, those who continue their pilgrimage on earth, those in Purgatory, and those already blessed in Heaven, We all form one big Family. This communion between heaven and earth is realized especially through intercessory prayer and the liturgical celebrations of All Saints (Nov. 1) and All Souls (Nov. 2). In order to make it more convenient for as many as possible to live the Communion of Saints, the Mass for **Nov. 1** (All Saints) will be at 9:00 am, followed by scheduled adoration, to conclude with Sacred Heart Prayers at 3:00 pm. The Mass for **Nov. 2** (All Souls) will be at 9:00 am followed by personal prayers for our deceased loved ones.
