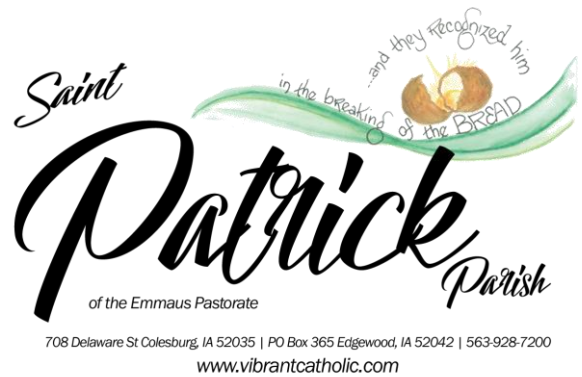


St Patrick Parish Council Meeting

Parish Fish Fry-Feb 26th

There was a discussion on how to proceed during the Covid 19 restrictions. It was decided to have a walk through-carry out meal only.

Sarah Mormann presented a proposal to have two boxes for the meal, hot food including four piece cod, parsley potatoes and corn and a cold box which would include coleslaw, dinner roll and dessert. Tartar sauce also. No milk or water would be included. After a brief discussion it was decided not to have parishioners bring desserts but have J & D provide sheet cakes in white or chocolate. Price would be \$12.00 per meal and a box of twelve pieces of cod for \$20.00. Dean was to check into ordering the cod from Earlville Locker same as last year and to prepare for possibly 700 or more. Deanne was going to work on volunteer work sheets. Not as many would be needed this year as there was no garbage pick up and no small individual containers to fill. We would have an efficient assembly line and some boxes could be made up ahead of time.

Deanne mentioned the 50/50 raffle and it was approved. There would be no food containers brought in for a discount.

We will meet again after the Town Hall meeting to finalize plans and work schedules.

Prepare for May parish elections

Carol Steger agreed to stay for one more year and Lucas will stay another term. The Parish Life group thought no new persons were needed to replace Carol Vorwald as two couples volunteered last year.

Faith Formation-Deanne said the terms of Diane Domeyer and Lisa Barnhart would be over but she was confident that replacements would be found for the elections.

Mass and Vigil January 19/20--Day of prayer for peace for our country

This was discussed briefly. Deanne announced that she would be streaming the mass and the holy hours would go in a loop during the night. Parishioners would be able to participate from their homes.

Carol announced that desserts were needed for the Mormann funeral lunch. Parish life group agreed to contact people who had indicated they would bring food on the annual talent census.
