# A Message from Fr. Miller/Other

Friends

Peace be with you.

I begin sharing a recent message from Archbishop Jackels. Before I do, I want to say that I thought and prayed long and hard about whether I should share this, not because I disagree with the Archbishop at all (which I don't) but because "bad gas travels fast, especially in a small town." However, I would hate for someone who genuinely wants to support a Catholic radio station to go to this and be led astray by a priest whose zealous love of tradition has led him to be more "Catholic" than the Catholic Church. So I ask that you heed the Archbishop's warning and not go.

Statement regarding a radio station event featuring Fr. Altman. Various folks are asking for a comment from the Archbishop regarding a Dubuque- based radio station and a speaker event it is sponsoring. It isn't a Catholic radio station per se. Its directors are Catholic. It airs Catholic programs. But it has no formal relationship with the Church or the Archdiocese. To make use of the term "Catholic" requires the permission of the local bishop, which has not been given to this radio station for two reasons:

- 1. Because the Church would then be responsible for the doctrinal content of their broadcasts; there aren't the resources to do that.
- 2. And because that nomenclature would benefit its fund-raising efforts; there are more needy recipients of donations.

For these reasons, the radio station shouldn't in any way be associated with archdiocesan parishes, so as to avoid confusion about its relation to the Church. And this applies most definitely to the speaker event featuring Father James Altman. He is a priest of the Diocese of La Crosse, but not in good standing. As a consequence, he may not celebrate Holy Mass or the sacraments in the Archdiocese of Dubuque. Also, at a recent speaking event he stated that some Vatican II documents are "bad news" and contain "sketchy stuff" which he says opens up the way to heresy. He went on to say that Bishop Barron is in error for teaching from those documents, and that he should take back what he said, or be thrown out of the Catholic Church. If that wasn't bad enough, the room full of Catholics who paid money to hear that priest speak, hooted and hollered, clapping loudly in approval! For those reasons, but also because the priest claims COVID is a con, and that it's a sin to vote for or be a Democrat, faithful Catholics should not attend that event. - Michael O. Jackels Archbishop of Dubuque

Sessions will be held usually on the 1st,  $3^{rd}$ , and  $5^{th}$  Sundays of the month following the 8 a.m. Mass held either at St. Donatus (September-October) or St. Catherine (November-April) parish. There will also be an opportunity for pre-schoolers and their parents to meet together on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month during the Faith Formation sessions in the months of September-November and January-March. No registration is necessary for this program.

Why do we have our Monthly Special Collections? We are asked to tithe – to share 10% of what we received – to give back to Our Lord in some way. The Church suggests that we donate 5% to the Church and 5% to others in need. The purpose of our parishes' Social Justice Commission is two-fold: 1. educate parishioners on area non-profit groups that reach out to help people in need; 2. provide a way for parishioners to help support the organizations either monetarily, materially, or personally with our "helping hands." Each year the Social Justice Commission seeks out area charitable groups to support, endeavoring to help some of the same each year while also seeking out new groups to introduce to members of our parishes.

Our **Monthly Special Collection designee** for September is the organization "Vision to Learn." The local Vision to Learn program provides free eye exams and free eyeglasses to students in Dubuque and Jackson Counties. Vision to Learn is a Mobile Eye Clinic that takes an optician and optometrist to schools and other programs, with the goal to help children to read at grade level by the end of third grade. Envelopes for donations to our monthly designees can be found, once again, at the end of each of our pews and placed in the regular collection basket at either parish any weekend of this month. Thank you for supporting those in need.

### Catechist Corner-Julie Schmidt

I was having a conversation with some ladies on my patio one night this summer and one of them mentioned how nice it would be if there was a program for our teenagers at our church. And I smirked and asked, "Like a youth group?" She responded, "Yes, exactly!"

It was then that I realized that maybe we don't share our programs with our parishioners as much as we should. Especially if parents of young children, like this friend, aren't even aware of what our parishes have to offer to our young people. So here goes...

Our parishes have a middle school youth group known as EPIC (Everything is Possible in Christ) for students in grades 6-8 that meets in the Kruse Center for a Food, Faith, and Fun afternoon about once a month after the 10:15 am Masses in Bellevue. Also, EPIC gathers once a month for an afternoon movie in the Kruse Center. This summer, EPIC participated in our first Service and Fun days. We gathered on a Saturday and completed service projects (garage cleaning, landscaping, window washing, weed pulling, etc) for parishioners in need and on Sunday, we went to Mass together and then traveled to Dubuque for a movie and Pizza Ranch.

Since 2008, our parishes have had an active high school Youth Group, participating in activities ranging from carving pumpkins with the individuals at the DAC home to leading the Stations of the Cross to taking a trip to a Haunted House. Two of the Youth Group favorites are the annual photo scavenger hunt and the 3-day mission trip each summer to assist with clean up in a town that has been hit by a natural disaster. Also, every other year, we send students and chaperones to the National Catholic Youth Conference- this November we have 30 students making the trek to Indianapolis.

There is no registration or sign up to be a "member" of either the EPIC program or Youth Group. Just show up! We do collect permission forms for events that take us off campus. All of the events are listed in the parish bulletin and announced at weekend Masses. If a student or parent has a question about attending our events, please contact me at <u>DBQ012ym@dbqarch.org</u>.

Of course there is no way that I could lead all of these events on my own! We have over 60 other parishioners who have served as chaperones or helpers throughout the existence of our programs. And some of our Youth Group Alumni have jumped on board as adult volunteers. It has been very rewarding watching our teenagers grow into young adults of great faith and then pass it onto the young ones that follow
