

# A Message from Fr. Miller/Other

Friends

Peace be with you.

As part of the pilgrimage I'm leading next June, we plan to go to Broadway and see the musical Come From Away. At the time I put this together, I had no idea that Apple TV would be showing a filmed version of the play on their live streaming service. I've watched it twice since it was released on September 10 and have found it a very satisfying experience each time. Still, it will be even better live. Just as a general warning if you decide to watch it, it is a musical. I know musicals aren't everyone's cup of tea and that this musical suffers from some concessions to modern sensibilities that can be a bit annoying. However, overcoming the clash between small town hospitality and the skepticism associated with traveling is very heart warming for me. And, if you don't want to know about the musical before you go, you may want to stop reading here and either watch the Apple TV version or wait until after we see it on Broadway because I'm going to have some spoilers here..

There's a question that nags at me whenever I watch the play: Would we do the same? If you have no idea what I'm talking about, imagine if a number of visitors approximately equaling the population of your town were trapped there for five days. Gander is a town of nine thousand people and, because of American airspace being closed in the wake of the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, thirty eight planes carrying about seven thousand people were diverted there. At first, the town people set up temporary places in school gyms and local halls to move the "plane people" off the planes into somewhere they could stretch their legs, clean up, get some real food, and spread out. They fed them and set up phones for them to call their loved ones. When it became clear that the plane people weren't going to be leaving for a few days, they invited them into their homes to shower and get a good night's sleep and even invited them to become honorary Newfoundlanders or "Come From Aways" as the locals call them. .

Would we offer any such hospitality if people were trapped in our towns?

It's tempting to say that we absolutely would do this. Everyone reading this lives in a small town (Yes, even people from Bellevue), smaller than Gander. We generally look after our neighbors and care about building strong communities. Still, treating people from North and South America, Europe, Africa, Asia and (especially) the Middle East as neighbors the way the people of Gander displayed on that day is, at least in my estimation, Christ-like.

I worry that we've allowed the worst behaving people to shape how we feel about people truly in need. We hear about people asking for money who waste it on drugs and alcohol so we stop giving money to anyone in need. We hear about hitchhikers kidnapping people and so we drive casually by without offering to help. We hear about the horror of human trafficking and believe pretty much any weird object placed on or near a car is a sign of someone

trying to carry out an abduction. How can we overcome fear of the worst case scenario to be a channel of God's peace?
