"SIGN OF PEACE" GESTURE AND FLU OR WINTER COLD: Because shaking hands is an American custom, parishioners concerned about possible transmission of flu or a winter cold find it difficult and uncomfortable to avoid hand-to-hand contact at the sign of peace and become anxious about offending fellow parishioners. The ritual guideline for the sign of peace states: "All make an appropriate sign of peace, according to local custom." While shaking hands is an appropriate practice, it is not the designated or only suitable gesture for the sign of peace. A parishioner at risk for a cold because of health or age can occupy their hands with a hymnal, pair of gloves or purse, etc., nod their head in the exchange of the peace greeting and offer a smile to forestall misunderstanding or impression of unfriendliness. Most parishioners will not misinterpret another parishioner using average social graces during the sign of peace. Although hand-to-hand contact can spread a cold, anyone in reasonably good health has the necessary defense mechanisms to protect against any significant infection in the casual social contact that occurs at the sign of peace. As the sign of peace is an expression of faith in our oneness in the Lord, however, sensitivity to another's health concern is most appropriate.

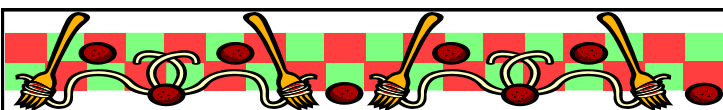
